Preface

These records are the legacy of our Yarbrough family researchers, to whom much is owed. The known family researchers include Jean Baker, Ann Y. Broadbent, Mary Y. Daniel, Frances (Rea) Donohue, Betty Humrighouse, Pauline Gray, Evelyn Goble, Nelle Morris Jenkins, Ophelia Kessler, Frances Lockwood, Karen Mazock Renee Smelley, Dorothy Svec, Jeanette Wilson, Cleveland "Cy" Yarbrough, Edna Yarbrough, George A. Yarbrough, and Robert Price Yarbrough.

The originals of these volumes are being kept for the benefit of future generations by the Williamson County Library, Franklin, Tennessee.

No claims of accuracy or authentication of the material herein are made or may be assumed. Many of these records have been superseded by subsequent research. Hence, there are records which are erroneous and unreliable; it would have been a Herculean task to attempt to correct all of them. Fortunately, there are only a few critical genealogical facts that are involved, and which are correctly stated here:

- Richard (the Immigrant) Yarborough was never married to Frances Proctor;
- Ambrose Yarbrough did not immigrant from Yorkshire; he is now believed to be a descendant of Richard the Immigrant;
- There are so far only two proven sons of Old Richard John and Richard II;
- There is so far no evidence proving Joshua Yarborough I to be a descendant of Old Richard.
- The "Old Country" referred to in old documents and letters is the Colony of Virginia, not England or the Old World.
- There were not seven brothers who immigrated from "the old country"; in fact, it now appears there were three brothers and four sons of the brothers. Which were the fathers and which were the sons are so far unknown.

In spite of these inaccuracies, these records comprise much of our history and some of our accomplishments. There are pages whose print quality is so poor that word recognition was not possible. In spite of that, at least partial capability for searching these volumes is provided, as well as an index to each volume. Nonetheless, the viewer is cautioned to perform his/her own due diligence in connection with any use of this material.

The various spellings of the Yarbrough surname have never been applied consistently, even within a given family. To the extent possible, the names in the index reflect the names used on the source pages; where it wasn't clear as to which might be the proper spelling, the spelling used is "Yarbrough".

(Compiled from Yvonne's letters; misc. court records; McCubbin's Notes on Rowan Co, NC, etc.)

When Joseph Cunningham d in 1769 sons George and James were only sons still living in Penn. Rest of the family was already in North Carolina.

James Cunningham (eldest son) was b. 1756 and was living in Washington County, NC when he enlisted in the Revolutionary War. By 1803 he and his family were already in Missouri. (Washington Co NC was part of NC that was later the State of Franklin and eventually became a part of Tennessee).

To keep Joseph C's straight, they will be designated thusly from here on:

Joseph I - Elder Joseph who d 1769 in Penn.

Joseph, Sr. - Son of Joseph I Joseph, Jr. - Son of Joseph, Sr.

(Hugh Cunningham ended up administrating this estate along with Joseph's brother Robert Cunningham. Ann died shortly after Joseph and Joseph, Jr. d. in 1803. They are buried at the Jersy Settlement Baptist Church near Lexington, NC)

Mary Yarborough referred to in will Of Joseph, Sr. married Manoah Yarborough on 16 Aug 1799 and they migrated to Alabama.

In his will, Joseph, Sr. willed son William "part in the iron works lying in the state of TENISE and Carten County." (I believe this should be Carter)
He left his other sons land "on Elk River in Tenise". It is probable that Anna (Cunningham) Davis and her husband Jonathan had gone to Tennessee and settled

The sixth child and second son of Evan and Mary Ann was John, born 1808 in North Carolina, died after 1850, married 13 January 1831 Susan Favors, who was born in Georgia. Issue: William M., born 1834; Samuel, born 1836; Mary Ann, born 1838; Evan, born 1840; Philip, born 1842; and Joel, born 1845.

Philip was the seventh child and third son of Evan and Mary Ann. He was born 1810 in North Carolina, died 1852, married 22 April 1841 Margaret Lester. In the 1850 Census of St. Clair County John is not shown with a wife or children. His mother was living with him.

The eighth child and fourth son of Evan and Mary Ann was Evan, Jr., born 3 July 1811, Rutherford County, North Carolina, died 28 February 1891, married 28 Decem-Ber 1837 Margaret Brown, born February 1820, St. Clair County. Alabama, died 31 January 1882, Jonesboro, Arkansas. Issue: James, died young; Eliza W., born 20 October 1839, died 19 June 1927, married Mr. McGowan; Jeha, died in the War Between the States; Miller, died in the War Between the States; Joe; Nannie, married Mr. Hargroves; David, born 1845, died 1935; Marzee. married William Barrett, born 1850, died 1891; Ross Philips, a preacher; Payton; Eunice C., born 1858, died 1943, married Mr. Edgar; Marion; and Cordelia, married Mr. Cochrane.

MANOAH YARBROUGH:

The following newspaper article was sent to me by Ray Isbell of Mobile, Alabama. Please note that there are two glaring errors. The first is that Manoah's name is spelled "Monah" throughout the article. The second is the statement that the Yarbrough's trace their history to 853 when William the Conqueror gave Dane Germund Yarbrough an earldom for services rendered in the Norman Invasion. William the Conqueror was born 1027 and reigned from 1066 to his death in 1087.

"BEAVER VALLEY --- Sitting in the early morning shadow of Beaver Mountain is a 155-year-old house which has been in the Yarbrough family since it was built.

John and his wife, Rebecca, live in the large three story home built in 1825 by John's great-great-grandfather Monah who came to the valley from North Carolina.

The Yarbrough's trace their history back to 853 A.D. when Dane Germund Yarbrough was given earldom by William the Conquerer for services rendered in the Norman Invasion.

Monah and his wife left behind a legacy in Beaver Valley. The Yarbrough estate once included almost 1000 acres and the large three-story house stands as evidence of hard work by slaves.

Mrs. Yarbrough is proud to show visitors a cream pitcher and sugar bowl brought to the valley by Monah's wife Mary.

Visitors can see huge beams, hand hewn by slaves, inside several rooms of the house and the two chimneys were made by John's great grandfather Littleton who also built the St. Clair County courthouse in Ashville.

Family records indicate that Littleton, 'commenced laying brick on the courthouse 23 Oct. 1844.'

He made 155,640 bricks to build the courthouse and paid \$2.50 per 1000 to have them laid.

The clay was taken from the north side of the square. The building consisted of one upstairs courtroom and four offices downstairs - one in each corner of the building.

The courthouse has gone through several renovations and additions since the time it was built.

Littleton is buried in the family cemetery nearby while Monah and his wife are buried in a nearby pasture.

Before his death, Littleton traveled to Texas where he built several courthouses.

Both Littleton and Monah were millers and distillers. They operated stills for the government and sold the whiskey to Jack Daniels.

John recalls the time when Littleton's brother Obediah and a slave set out for Jack Daniels Distillery when the horses, pulling the wagon, bolted and ran throwing out Obediah and killing him.

The slave buried him, delivered the whiskey, collected the money and returned to inform Littleton of the accident. Littleton and the slave returned to the gravesite, dug up Obediah's body and brought it back to Beaver Valley to be buried in the family cemetery.

John said Littleton had 40 slaves who were set free toward the end of the Civil war. 'Littleton and his wife decided to set the slaves free rather than sell them each for \$5,000 in gold. They were afraid someone would kill them for the gold,' John said.

Today the house is basically the same as it was in 1825. There have been some additions and the kitchen is no longer away from the house as it once was.

The Yarbrough coat-of-arms hangs in the living room. John said the shield is split because the earl from which the family sprang had two daughters but no sons.

The daughters married, but before they were allowed to do so their husbands had to take the Yarbrough name so that the line could be continued. Today it exists in Beaver Valley."

From the diary of Little Yarbrough covering the period from 1827 to his death (1879):
"I built the courthouse in Ashville. It has 155,640 bricks in it. I am to pay Cambell
Jefferson \$2.50 per thousand for them. I commenced laying the brick at the courthouse 23
Oct. 1844."

"4 June 1845 - Bricks paid in full."

Everything shared with you in the Archives section of this issue is something that has been shared with me by researchers. Now you have a good idea why "mail call" is my favorite time of day.

Recorded 29 Nov. 1836 D.C. Frazer Mary M. Frazer John Cunningham, Manoah's brother-in-law had been in St. Clair County since 1818.he had helped to organize the county. It is said that Manoah had come from N.C. via Tennessee and Huntsville, Alabama, and was making his way toward Choccolocco Valley in Benton County (Now Calhoun). When he arrived at the ferry now known as Greensport, he learned that the Cherokee Indians were still fighting the whites in that section. So he settled on Beaver Creek in St. Clair County. At first the land had to be cleared and a cabin built until a better house could be erected. There was a cave in the side of the mountain across the creek-the cave was at the foot of the mountain opening on level ground. Manoah built a crude room and porch in front of this cave where the family lived until 1825 when the large home was finished. One day Mary, his wife, took sick with fever and chills. She got worse and worse. Finally she sent the children with her husband as she knuw she was going to die and she did not want them to see her in agony. She said she vomited blood until she passed out, Her family found her in a dying condition: but she rallied, and began to get better. People in that day thought rotting stumps gave them maleria: they had no idea that the mosquito that lived in the rotting *egetation gave them the fever and chills.

BIBLE RECORDS of MANOAH YARBROUGH

This Bible is owned by my aunt, Miss Elizabeth Yarbrough, Ashville Alabama. It was printed by the American Bible Society, New York in 1857. It was owned by Littleton Yarbrough, the son of Manoah. In the handwriting of Littleton Yarbrough the following data recorded.

Father and Mother (Manoah and Mary Cunningham) were married in the year of 1799 August 16th.

Sister Matilda Yarbrough was born 20 May 1800 and stayed in North Carolina. She married Gresham Hunt 3 January 1822. He died 4 March 1846.

Littleton Yarbrough was born 27 July 1802, in N.C. (I Littleton Yarbrough) married Nancy Ashcraft 7 April 1825.

Brother Wiley Yarbrough was born 6 July 1807, died 8 September 1874. Unmarried. Polly Yarbrough, my sister, was born 12 Feb. 1810, kied in N.C. 1815.

My brother Manoah Yarbrough Jr. was born 14 April 1813; died in Miss. 16 Feb. 1863. He married Alamurthy Brown 27 December 1832.

Obediah (my brother) never married. He was killed by a run-a-way team.

Littleton and Nancy Yarbrough were Baptized 30 September 1849, Ashville, Ala.

Father (Manoah Yarbrough) deceased 27 September 1836.

Mother (Mary Cunningham) Deceased 24, July 1840.

(In another hand was the added information)

Littleton Yarbrough died 1 October 1879.

Nancy Yarbrough died 14 July 1883. (She was the wife of Littleton).

Drury Ashcraft (father of Nancy Yarbrough) born 1 December 1773; died 18 Nov. 1843. Also in this Bible, on a fly leaf, is a list of the Yarbrough slaves. The first one was "Wiles" and last named was Rachel, born 20 March 1865. It is said that Littleton Yarbrough freed about 45 slaves in 1865. There is no record of his having sold any slaves.

When Joseph Cunningham d in 1769 sons George and James were only sons still living in Penn. Rest of the family was already in North Carolina.

James Cunningham (eldest son) was b. 1756 and was living in Washington County, NC when he enlisted in the Revolutionary War. By 1803 he and his family were already in Missouri. (Washington Co NC was part of NC that was later the State of Franklin and eventually became a part of Tennessee).

To keep Joseph C's straight, they will be designated thusly from here on:

Joseph I - Elder Joseph who d 1769 in Penn.

Joseph, Sr. - Son of Joseph I Joseph, Jr. - Son of Joseph, Sr.

Robert Moore (son-in-law of Joseph I) d in Rowan County, NC. His will was probated in 1779 (Will Book B, p 117-Rowan Co) and names:

(Hugh Cunningham ended up administrating this estate along with Joseph's brother Robert Cunningham. Ann died shortly after Joseph and Joseph, Jr. d. in 1803. They are buried at the Joseph Settlement Baptist Church near Lexington, NC)

Mary Yarborough referred to in will Of Joseph, Sr. married Manoah Yarborough on 16 Aug 1799 and they migrated to Alabama.

In his will, Joseph, Sr. willed son Villiam "part in the iron works lying in the state of TENISE and Carten County." (I believe this should be Carter) He left his other sons land "on Elk River in Tenise". It is probable that Anna (Cunningham) Davis and her husband Jonathan had gone to Tennessee and settled

on her father's share of that land.

Joseph Cunningham, Jr. married Mary Cunningham, daughter of his Uncle Hugh Cunningham about 1799-1800. Will of Joseph, Jr. dated 4 April 1803 (Will Book D, page 11-Rowan County) probated 1803 calls him yeoman and names:

Wife: Mary

sons: William (a minor); Joseph (a minor)

Daus: Anna (a minor)

(Will also names children Sarah Grady and Hugh Mailey who were both underage. Joseph is said to have married first Ann Hendrixon. No marriage record has been found for this marriage. The two unidentified children may have been his children from a first marriage)

Exrs: Wife Mary and Robert Moore.

Will of Hugh Cunningham (Will Book G, p 486-Rowan Co, NC) -- This is son of Joseph I, brother of Joseph Sr. and Uncle of Joseph Jr. -- is dated 4 Sep 1817 and probated in 1817. It names:

Ack. by William Cunningham Nov term of 1822. This is part of 310 acres sold by Henry Eustace McCulloch to Joseph Cunningham and he devised it to Joseph Cunningham, Jr. and Griffith Cunningham.

In the Tipton County Will Book A-1, p 81- Will of Henry Yarbrough, he leaves:

"I give and bequeath Anna Davis the daughter of my deceased wife or to her heirs the sum of one hundred dollars.

"I give and bequeath to William Cunningham the son of my deceased wife or to his heirs the sum of one hundred dollars."

Because the daughter's name is Davis, some researchers have taken this to mean that she was the daughter of his first wife, Bridget Davis, and have listed that Bridget Davis was a widow with one child. These same researchers have shown the William Cunningham to have been the child of his (Henry's) second wife by her first marriage.

The will of Bridget's father, Myrick Davis, clearly shows that she was not a widow and that Henry Yarbrough, Jr. was the son of Bridget and Henry Yarbrough.

The will of Joseph Cunningham, Jr. names a son William and a daughter Anna. Deeds clearly show that this Ann married a Davis and lived in Lincoln County, Tennessee.

Therefore, both Anna and William named in Henry's will were children of his second wife, Mary Cunningham and her first husband, Joseph Cunningham, Jr.

In his 1808 Will, Myrick Davis says "my three grandchildren" and the only one of Henry Y's children he names is Henry, Jr. If Henry & Bridgett had daughters, I wonder why Myrick did not name them in his will as he did name other granddaughters.

The age on Henry Jr.'s tombstone has to be wrong (36 years). It says "departed this life Jan 3d 1841, aged 36 years. This would make his mother Mary Cunningham as she and Henry married in 1803. As he is clearly named in the Will of Myric Davis as the son of his daughter, the age on the tombstone has to be an error. If the "3" is actually a "5" -- which it looks like -- this would make his birth around 1785 if he died at age 56. This would be closer to the right time for him.

The Jan. 5d 1841 could stand for January - 5th day 1841.

The Tombstone says Henry D. Yarbro. Is there actually any proof that this is Henry Yarbro, Jr.??

Your opinion, please.

The Yarbrough-Yarborough family The name has been spelled variou ways: Yarberry, Yarber, Yarborough Yarbourough, Yarby, Yawbo, etc. Ac cording to the chart prepared by the College of Arms, London, England, the original spelling was Yarhourgh, a ne the family record begins with Eustac ius de Yerburgh, lord of the Manor o Yarborough (or Yarburgh) County, Lin coln. Soon after some of the descend ants of Eustacius spelled the name Yarbry, even in this day, there are brothers who use different spellings of the name. It is family tradition that the families during the Civil War spelled their names indicating whether they were Southerners or "Yankees."

According to English records the name pertains to a place of residence. Webster says "Borough" in the Anglo-Saxon days meant "a fortification," or a fortified manor or house. Regardless of any kind of spelling, the family has the same origin dating back to the family in England in 1653. The family came into Virginia, locating in Amelia County, sometime between 1729 and 1775. It is said there were seven brothers: Zachariah, who on arriving settled in Louisburg, Franklin Co., North Carolina. Archibald, Manoali, Alexander Thomas, Henry and John Yarborough.

There is a Yarborough Family Magizine edited and published by Chas and Jean Smith Yarborough of Austin, Texas. This branch of the family pertains to that of Texas' Sen. Ralph Yarborough. Colonial records of the family in this publication begin in Savannah, Georgia, May 1770, and is the petition of Manoah Yarborough' stating he had been eight months in the Province of North Carolina, had had no land granted him previously, and was desirous to obtain land for cultivation.

We next find him located on 100 acres of land on Ogechee at a place called "Case's Camp" in St. George's Parish about three miles below the lower Trading Path. This land according to records was granted him for his services in the Revolutionary War.

were then lost Therefore the first census we have is that of 1820.

The Reverend Ambrose Yarbrough (1772-1861) was the son of Jonathan and Emilia Yarbrough. He was born in Ansom County, North Carolina in 1772 and died in Lauderdale County, Mississippi in 1861. He married Elizabeth Culpepper in 1797. She was the daughter of John and Mary Culpepper. He is said to have converted hundreds in his day and was a loved pasfor in churches throughout Mississippi, and Alabama, His second wife was Phoebe Holcom.

Joseph Randolph Yarbrough was born in Tennesee 1817. He came to Texas in 1832 and he received his headright in 1838, he married Clementine Crawford in 1840, they are both buried at Grapeland, Houston County, Tex. Last November the Henderson County Historical Survey Committee dedicated the home of Charles Richard Yarborough (birthplace of Sen. Ralph Webster Yarborough) at Athens, Tex.

Some families are naturally "family minded" and inherit a deep love and respect for their heritage. These families are the ones who keep their records and family "ties". Such a family is that of Senator Yarborough. He is dedicated to American Heritage and he participates in all historical functions over the state, not to make a speech or a political impression, but because his roots are deep in things of history and worthy of restoration.

I have been so proud of him in making his appearances and always encouraging communities to be proud of their background and save old landmarks. He is a man of courage and one on whom we can depend.

A statesman, we are told, is one who shows unusual ability and wis form in dealing with or directing public affairs. The Yarboroughs seem to inherit their statesmanship for there are G. M. Yarbrough of Mississippi (state senator), G. W. Yarbrough of Alabama (state senator) and Texas' own Ralph Yarborough.

Through the years there have been numerous publications on the various branches of the family. The late Nelle Morris Jenkins of Emelle, Alabama published a Yarbrough Quarterly which she dedicated to her immigrant ancestors Richard and Francis Yarbrough.

Her grandfather was John Yarbrough, the son of Littleton and Nancy (Ashcraft) Yarbrough. They lived in St. Clair County, Alabama. Mrs. Jenkins published these quarterlies for at least three years; the subscription rate was four dollars per year. 

year 1046, to conqueror or England, gave him the Earldom of Yorkshire county, England, which Earldom still exists. Some of the Yarbrough gentry came from England in the early settlement of Virginia, and located in Amelia county of that state. 5 Between the years 1729 and 1775 seven brothers of the Yarbroughs 6 moved to Louisburg, Franklin county, N. Carolina. There names were: Zachariah, Archibald, Manoah, Alexander, Thomas, Henry and John. Before the Revolutionary War, 1775, Zachariah left Louisburg and settled in Rowan county, now Davidson county. There he met and married Elizabeth Dowd. Their children were: Zachariah, Henry, Thomas, Alexander, Manoah, Julia and Elizabeth.

Thomas married Jemina Merrill of Lexington. There were the parents of Rev. Aaron Yarbrough who was a Presbyterian minister of much renown, born October 5, 1813, began to preach February 4, 1834. Died December 30, 1897. 85 years of age. He married Elizabeth Wommack. Some of the ancestors are buried at Hargrave Place, Lexington, N. Carolina.

Our grandparents were Manoah Yarbrough and his wife, Mary Cunningham, from Rowan county, N. Carolina. Manoah was born in 1770, Mary, his wife on Nov. 12, 1778. They were married August 16, 1799. Both of their fathers no doubt fought in the Revolu-tionary War. Manoah died September 27, 1836, and his wife July 24, 1840. Their graves are in a field called Yarbrough Cemetery, near the old home place, 4 miles southeast of Ashville, Alabama, graves marked by stones, which in 1926, were in good shape. Their children were:

- 1. Matilda Yarbrough, born May 20, 1800, married Graham Hunt. Died in N. Carolina.
- 2. Littleton Yarbrough, born May 20, 1802. Married Nancy Ashcraft, whose mother was a Baker. She died in 1879. Nancy came from a fine old family of much renown in those war-time days. Nancy died June 14, 1883.

Littleton's ability was far above the average for his time, considering the surroundings of pioneer days. Reuben Philips furnished him some money and he went horseback to Texas, took up

contracting, and built court houses and jails all over East Texas, one of which is still standing at Tyler, Texas. He also built one at Clarksville, Texas, and the court house and Baptist church at Ashville, Alabama, which still are a memorial to him. Both he and wife are buried in Yarbrough Cemetery, near Ashville, Alabama. His children and grand children who "rise up and call him blessed" are as follows:

l. George Yarbrough, born June 2, 1826. While a young man made the celebrated trip to California in '49 to seek his fortune in the gold filed, going by way of Panama, did well financially, returned to Tyler, Texas, where on July 18, 1855, he married a highly cultured, capable woman, Miss Augusta Herrin. He established a mercantile business in 1852, this afterwards became Yarbrough and Wimberly, then Wimberly and Philips in 1875, and now Geo. R. Philips Band Sons in 1927 a business of 75 years duration. George Yarbrough was a man of good business acumen, a staunch member of the Baptist church, in which he took a leading part. He was a great student of character, and loved his family and family connections, his home was a home for all the relatives, and each of the Philips boys, sons of his sister, Elizabeth, at different times lived with him, and appreciated his wise counsel and staunch integrity. He passed away after a long illness, February 25, 1899, his wife Augusta, hiving died July 15, 1890. Both are buried by their daughter, Ione in Tyler Cemetery. The home on South Broadway is still owned by the daughters. They had three daughters:





DESCRIPTION

The Yarbrough Building at present is a 2 story structure made of handmade brick with approximately 4' of "crawl space" between the ceiling of the 2nd floor and the present roof. It occupies the East 25' of Lot 2 and the West 10' of Lot 3, Blk. 1, original plat of City of Tyler. It was originally a 3 story building but about 20 years ago the top story was considered unsafe and the Bergfeld Estate who owned the building at that time removed the roof and about 8' of the walls and lowered the roof leaving only a two story building. The building also contains a basement which provides an ex-

cellent view of the foundations. The center bearing sill is approximately 10" X 12" of hand-hewn oak and runs the full length of the building. The brick walls are on a "pad" type footing being several brick wide at basement floor tapering into regular wall thickness approximately 2' above the basement floor level. The second floor (as did the 3rd floor) has fireplaces built into the side walls for heating. The building has been modernized on the front covering the old style windows and hand made brick.

HISTORY

January 2, 1856 John C. Holman sold the West 14'

of Lot 3. Blk 1 to Varbrough and Ferguson together with the building thereon for \$3007 and on February 4, 1856 he also sold Yarbrough and Ferguson an undivided 1/2 interest in the east 1/2 (25') of Lot 2, Blk. 1 for \$110.00.2 Ferguson sold his 1/4th interest in the east 1/2 of Lot 2 and his 1/2 interest in the west 14' of Lot 3 to Yarbrough May 15, 1857 for \$208.00.3 On May 16, 1857 Yarbrough purchased the other 1/2 interest in the east 1/2 of Lot 2 from G. W. Chilton and J. F. Warren.⁴ It is interesting to note that the deeds to Yarbrough from Ferguson and from Chilton and Warren are both dated in 1857 but were not filed for record until May of 1858. The Yarbrough building was constructed in 1858 or 1859.⁵ It would appear from the records that Yarbrough did not record his deeds until he was ready to start his building. It was leased to the Confederate States of America for use as a cartridge factory from 1863 to 1865.6 Since Yarbrough was a partner in the ordnance works prior to the sale to C. S. A. in 1863 the building was probably used as a part of the ordnance plant prior to 1863.


On May 20, 1865 George Yarbrough sold the building and lot to his brother Burk Yarbrough for \$4,890.00.⁷ Burk Yarbrough operated a mercantile business until his death in 1874. Lucy Yarbrough, widow of Burk Yarbrough, apparently leased the building to various people. Lucy Yarbrough, who married L. C. Blair in November 1881, retained ownership jointly with her 3 children until 1919 when the property was sold to R. Bergfeld.⁸ In recent years the property was sold by the Bergfeld Estate to Roosth and Genecov.

It has been impossible to determine the complete chain of occupants of the building. Throughout the years it has been used by various types of retail stores on the ground floor with doctors and dentists using the second floor as office space. The 3rd floor, for at least one time, served as living quarters. The building was leased to C. S. A. from September 1863 until the end of the war for \$150 per month.⁹ Records and dates of other occupants are not known. In the 1930's it was occupied by Woolworth Co.¹⁰ and at present the first floor is divided into two units with one being used for attorney's offices and the other by a Finance Company. The second floor is vacant.

In 1970 during conversation with Julius Bergfeld he related that at the time the portion of the third story was removed they had also removed the flooring from the 3rd floor. In the space between the ceiling of the 2nd floor and flooring of the 3rd floor they had recovered several handfuls of "old bullets". This fact was verified in conversation with Elmer Sharp who was the contractor on the job. All these "bullets" had been discarded and we were unable to locate even one. In 1971 permission was obtained from the owners, Roosth and Genecov, and members of the Smith County Historical Society and Survey Committee made a partial search of the 3rd floor area and recovered 1 bullet, 4 mini balls, and approximately 20 buck shot which had spilled out from the "Buck and Ball" cartridges of the Confederate era.

We have had since the organization, thirty-one pastors. It appears from the records that some of the years that the church was without a regular pastor, as in the year 1866, when Elders Manning, Cross and Miller preached at times for the church.

The membership at present numbers one hundred and two. An increase of 100 per cent since moving to Winona.

The church has two record books. The first from the organization until December, 1876. From November, 1874 to December 1876 the records have been torn and mutilated, and there is no record for about two years. With this little gap of two years in it, we have the records of the church for nearly 54 years. We find names of members on these old rolls who once filled their seats regularly, who have gone to join the great reunion on the other shore. There is not a living member today who was in the church in '49.

Sister Margaret Marsh was the last one of the charter members. She died on April 18, 1901. She was a member in the organization, and at her death, a little over fifty-one years.

I will not go into details naming these old members. Most of them were buried in Harris Creek grave yard and surrounding grave yards in the county.

We find from the records that the church disciplined her members closer than at present. The members were dealt with for using profane language, intemperance, not paying their just debts, having labor performed on Sunday, etc. We notice one brother who was arraigned for picking cotton on Sunday, and another for hiring and making contracts on Sunday with laborers.


We find on the rolls of forty and fifty years ago the names of servants who were members until their emancipation in 1865. The colored population who were members were slaves, and were members in the church with the whites. They had no separate organization or church. They were received as members in all of the churches. There was a portion of the church house assigned to the colored members, and colored part of the congregation. After they were emancipated they organized colored churches, and the white churches granted letters when called for that they might unite with their churches. The writer knows of but one living who was a member of Harris Creek church, and was lettered out after emancipation. His name is Anthony Watts living near Winona.

Will state that at present old Harris Creek church presents a bright future. Our beloved pastor, Rev. W. T. Rouse, is a true minister and pastor indeed, and the church is in fine working order under his care.

We have a fine Sabbath school, superintended by brother Henry Bronch. We can say of him, that he is the right man in the right place.

In concluding this sketch, will state that these grand old pioneer Baptist ministers of thirty, forty and fifty years ago, laid broad and deep the foundations of this great state. And also of later, but equally as worthy, characters who by their self-sacrifice for the cause of our Redeemer, have continued to carry on these foundations.

I will not at any time say anything individually of these great and good men found on our church rolls. Nearly all of these old pioneer preachers and church members have died, and their spirits have gone to greet the Master, and to receive that great declaration from Him, "welcome thou good and faithful servants; enter thou into the joy of the Lord."

ELDER WM. H. RAY'S DESK AND BIBLE



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Harris Creek Baptist

(In 1849, Rev. Wm. H. Ray organized HARRIS CREEK BAPTIST CHURCH near present Winona. The following historical sketch of the successor to that body, First Baptist Church in Winona, was written for a booklet published in 1949 on the occasion of the church's centennial celebration.

It was written by J. H. King and is only a part of that 12—page booklet. Because of its connection to Rev. Ray, this section is reproduced here. —Ed.)

At the January term, 1850, the committee was retained and authorized to let out the building, and receive same when completed. We learn, not from the records, but from old members, that the house was built of hewed pine logs, hauled from east of where Starrville now stands, with ox teams. We also

learn that the house was about twenty or twenty-four feet square.

At the July term the church elected Jas. A. McDonald chorister, and afterward ordered the treasurer, Geo. W. Chilton, to advance money to buy a hymn book. It was the custom in those days for the minister to line the hymn, or read a stanza, and sing, and so on, through the song service. Three brethren were elected to assist the chorister in singing, to-wit: W. L. McGregor, Harry Yarborough and George McIntosh, Bro. Bradley,our present chorister, would not have been in it in those days, as the song service of today is so different from those days.

At the February term, 1850, Elder Ray delivered a lecture on temperance, admonishing the brethren to guard against the evils of intemperance. The records show that the church had dealings with some of the members who had been guilty of intoxication.

Public education has always been one of the aims of the State of Texas as evidenced by its first state constitution in 1845 which called for the setting aside of not less than one-tenth of its annual revenue from taxation for a permanent school fund. This slowly growing fund was supplemented by legislation passed in January 1854 which was strongly supported by the Governor, Elisha E. Pease. A special school fund of two million dollars was set aside from the state treasury with the interest to be apportioned to the various counties based on their school age population. Furthermore, each county's school board was to consist of the chief justice (county judge) and the county commissioners. Though the 1854 law did not bring immediate results of statewide school systems, it was the first of a series of legislation to bring about the Texas public school system of today.

To further comply with the 1854 law, Jonathan Lewter of Smith County joined eighty-eight other tax assessors and collectors to compile a scholastic census of their respective counties. This list was transmitted to the county clerk, R.W. Chapman, and then sent to the state treasurer. For qualifying districts, appropriations amounted to sixty-two cents per child.

A photostatic copy of this first scholastic census of Smith County is part of the collection of Texas history of the Dallas Public Library. The census is divided into nine districts which strongly correspond to the Smith County Commissioners Court districts of that day:

4. Starrville 7. Whitehouse 10. Garden Valley

2. Mt. Vernon 5. Jamestown 8. Mt. Carmel

6. Canton 9. Seven Leagues with the exception that District 10 is combined with District 3 on the scholastic census. The census lists the head of the household with the names of all school age children living there. For purposes of this publication, each district has been alphabetized.

The reader, especially a family researcher, should be aware of possible sources of errors in this list. Census takers often spelled names as they heard them and may have used unique spellings for even common names. The transcriber for this publication has, to the best of his ability, copied the list with the same spellings, even when errors are known to exist, but the penmanship of the original rolls often is difficult to decipher. Some names presented here are "best guesses", or, checked as closely as possible with the 1850 and 1860 United States population schedules. A final source of error is the fact that even though the children in a household may have a different surname, (stepchildren, for example), this fact was not noted on this census.

George H. Yarbrough was born in Alabama June 6, 1826. Very little is known of his early life. During the 1840's he migrated to California and was in business there during the gold rush days which apparently proved very profitable as he returned to Alabama with \$15,000 to \$20,000 in cash. The trips from Alabama to California and return were made by boat around the southern tip of South America.¹

On his return to Alabama he entered into the mercantile business and while on a buying trip to New Orleans one of the wholesale men introduced him to Col. Alfred Ferguson, a prominent Tyler, Texas merchant. Col. Ferguson persuaded Yarbrough to come to Tyler and form a partnership with him in the mercantile business.²

The exact date of George Yarbrough's arrival in Tyler is not known, but it probably was in the early part of 1854. On November 24, 1854, he purchased the east 36' of Lot 3, Blk. 1 from Ira Ellis for \$1,400.00.3 The sale price, when compared with price of other lots around the Tyler Public Square, indicated that lot included a building. As an example of prices, John Holman sold the East 1/2 (25') Lot 2 to Yarbrough and Ferguson in February 1856 for only \$110.00.4 On January 2, 1856 John Holman sold the West 14' of Lot 3 together with building and improvements for \$300.00 to George Yarbrough and Alfred Ferguson "Trading Partners" doing business as Yarbrough and Ferguson.⁵ It would appear that at the time of the latter purchase, the business of "Yarbrough and Ferguson" was being transacted in the building acquired by Yarbrough in 1854. In May 1857 Yarbrough purchased Ferguson's interest in the East 1/2 of Lot 2 (25') and the West 14' of Lot 3 on which would later be built the 3 story Yarbrough Building.6 There are indications that the partnership of Yarbrough and Ferguson was terminated in 1857, but the tax records for 1859 show a rendition of merchandise for Yarbrough and Ferguson with a value of \$8,174.00. If the tax renditions are correct, we must assume that the mercantile partnership continued operations after 1857 in a building owned personally by Yarbrough.

In January 1856 George Yarbrough purchased from Col. Ferguson 2 lots fronting 160 yards along the East side of South Broadway bounded on the North by Front Street and on the East by what is now South Fannin Street (then identified as an alley). It was on this property that George Yarbrough established his home with Col. Bryan Marsh as his neighbor on the South. (The old Marsh home is still standing and presently occupied by Ray Woodney Park Antiques.) In the same transaction with Col. Ferguson in January 1856, Yarbrough acquired 116 acres of land West of South Broadway and South of Front Street.

In 1862 George Yarbrough, W.S.N. Biscoe and J. C. Short established the Tyler Ordnance Works and

entered into a contract with the Military Board of Texas to build 5000 rifles for the Confederacy. Apparently Yarbrough was instrumental in financing the operation and Short and Biscoe furnished the technical and manufacturing skills. Due to labor problems and other difficulties this enterprise was sold to the Confederate States of America in 1863. After the sale, Yarbrough leased his 3 story building to the ordnance work for use as a cartridge factory.

At the close of the War between the States it appears that George Yarbrough, like other southern business men who had expended most of their wealth on the Southern Cause, was in a difficult financial position. In May 1865, George Yarbrough sold the 3 story brick building on the East 1/2 of Lot 2 and West 10' of Lot 3 to Burk Yarbrough, his brother, for \$4,890.00.10 In July 1865 George Yarbrough executed a Deed of Trust lien to J. C. Fowler on the original "George Yarbrough Store Building" on the East 36' of Lot 3. This lien was given as security on a \$1,000 note made in 1861 less payments of \$173 in October 1863 and \$152.58 on July 1,1865.11 In March 1869 by order No. 86 of District Court J. K. Williams, assignee of George Yarbrough Bankrupt, deeded the 36' of Lot 3 and the old store building to J. C. Fowler. 12


The Deed Records of Smith County indicate that following the reconstruction period Yarbrough entered the real estate business and apparently recouped some of his financial losses. He developed the residential area south of West Front Street on what apparently was the land acquired from Col. Ferguson in 1856. Three of the streets in the area were named for his daughters, Annie, Mary and Ione. ¹³ The names of Annie, Mary and Ione Streets were later changed to South Bois d'Arc, Chilton and Charnwood respectively. It is interesting to note that the two parallel streets were named for the twins, Annie and Mary while the cross street was named for the eldest, Ione.

George Yarbrough was also a leader in civic affairs in Tyler. In April 1878 he along with T. J. Wiley and Jno. H. Bonner were appointed School Trustees. ¹⁴ In 1882 when the Tyler Baptist Church was organized George Yarbrough was one of the trustees and was also one of the signers of the application for the Charter. ¹⁵ After the Church was established he served as a deacon.

Yarbrough was first married to Miss Margarett Herrin of Tuskagee, ¹⁶ Alabama, who died July 15, 1890. His second marriage was to Miss Mary Copeland in Tyler November 19, 1896. ¹⁷ Yarbrough died February 2, 1899 and is buried in Oakwood Cemetery, Tyler, Texas.

ABOUT OUR CONTRIBUTORS TO THIS ISSUE

It was proved at the trial, that HUNT had possession of the negro at time of testator's death, and several years previously, under a parol gift from him to HUNT's wife. HUNT hired her from the executor and while in his possession sold her to one FINLEY, who brought her to Alabama and sold her to defendant.

BALFOUR, a life right in my negro boy Mike; also such articles as she and my wife may agree upon, to the value of \$100.

"Item--I give \$1000 to be paid at my wife's death, and to be divided in equal proportions betwixt the following Benevolent Societies, viz: the Baptists Society for Foreign and Domestic Missions and the American and Foreign Bible Societies; and at my sister EMILY's death, if the boy Mike given to her during her lifetime be alive, he shall be sold to the best advantage and the proceeds of the sale equally divided between the Societies above named.

"Volume A [Smith Co., Texas Deed Book], Pages 178, etc. dated July 7, 1851, states that a contract was entered into between Littleton Yarbrough and Justice Holman, which provided that the said Yarbrough was to furnish materials for and build a brick courthouse in middle of the square and that the build. ing should be so advanced on the first Monday in April A.D. 1852 as to enable the Supreme and District Courts to be held. within said building during the Spring term of said Courts for the year 1852, for which the said Yarbrough was to receive the sum of nine thousand dollars for building this brick courthouse.

"The cornerstone of this two-story, brick courthouse which formerly stood in the center of public square in Tyler was evidently laid on December 31, 1851."1



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

Emanuel W. Parton while he was serving in Company "K," Steven's Regiment. Rachel C. Evans married in 1866 to James T. Watson and John W. Evans married Nancy E. Good.

When the large Parton family with married children, Montgomery, Owens, Teeter, and Tabor moved to Williamson County in 1868, Betsy Ann took her youngest son and went with her married daughters also. These families bought land from the S. J. Dover survey on Brushy Creek and Bagdad was their post office. Most of the adults of these families were members of the New Hope Baptist Church until the families left for Somervell County in mid 1870s. Betsy returned to Grayson County with James and Rachel Watson in 1880, but soon joined her daughter Nancy Parton with whom she lived out her life.

Nancy Parton buried her husband (E)Manuel Parton in Pottsville Cemetery in Hamilton County in 1900 and then moved her family to Eastland County, taking Betsy Ann with her. Betsy Ann Wooten died 3 June 1904 and is buried at the Merriman Cemetery in Eastland County. Beside her, Nancy Parton was laid to rest in 1930. Contact with John W. Evans, Rachel Watson, and William L. Wooten families is trying to be re-established to honor this pioneer lady. Betsy Ann traveled the States from Alabama to Illinois to Texas, she raised four children without a husband, yet aided in helping education and religion to have a place in the pioneer days. We honor her memory.

PARSON JOSHUA H. WRIGHT By Mrs. David R. Stevens

Joshua H. Wright was born 5 April 1831 in Ohio. By the late 1840s he was orphaned in Texas. On 9 April 1853, in Anderson County, he married Elizabeth Jane Miller, daughter of Morgan and Elizabeth Miller, and born in Louisiana. Josh was a Primitive Baptist Minister.

The Joshua Wright family lived in the Corn Hill area around 1870, and are listed in the Williamson County census for that year. The last years of their lives, Josh and Janie lived near Youngsport, Bell County, and Josh served the Gravel Hill Primitive Baptist Church, east of Florence. They are buried in the Gravel Hill Cemetery, by the church. The church is no longer there. Parson Wright died 6 August 1898, and Janie died 16 December 1905.

Josh and Janie Wright had ten children: Rebecca Elizabeth (1854-1919) married Francis Wyatt; John William (1857-1939) married Sarah Elizabeth Pennington; Thomas E. (1859-1911?) married Elizabeth ———; Lydia A. (1861-1936) married William T. McGee of Florence; Nancy Jane (1863-1959) married Henry F. Levy; James J., born 1865, married Sally R. ——; Isaac Furman (1867-1883); Rosa Bell (1869-1937) married Brannick Stuart; Matilda Evelyn (1872-1944) married William A. Levy; and Mary M., born 1873, married William A. Hickman.

WILLIAM (BILLY) YARBROUGH By Edna Yarbrough

William (Billy) Yarbrough, born 24 October 1848 in Carrollton, Mississippi, was the son of Manqui Tarbrough II (1813–1863) and Martha Elizabeth Hobbs (1826–1906). After his father died in Mississippi during the Civil War, William and his mother lived with his aunt and uncle, W. R. and Isadora Hobbs. This family moved to Florence, Texas in the late 1860s where W. R. Hobbs became an overseer. It was there that William married Ann E. Moore, daughter of Elijah A. Moore (1810–1897) and Minerva Hobbs (1814–1873), 30 January 1877. The four children of this couple were born in Florence: Sue Murphy (1877–1961), Jack (1881–1951), Nora Haley (1884–1966), and Emma Hughes (1887–1969).

William and Ann lived in Florence a few years before moving to Killeen, Texas where he owned and operated a hardware store. About 1900 he and his cousin, W. O. Moore, opened a hardware store in Miles, Texas. Later they sold it, and William became the proprietor of the Palace Drugstore in Miles and operated it until his death, 18 December 1912. He is buried in the Miles Cemetery. He was a member of the Woodmen of the World.

Following her husband's death, Ann moved to Roscoe, Texas to be near her son, Jack and his wife, Carrie Woodard. At the time of her death, 18 January 1924, she was residing in Fort Worth, Texas with her daughter, Emma and her husband, Huel P. Hughes. She is buried in the Miles Cemetery.

RUDOLPH E. ZETT By Mrs. A. J. Adamek

Rudolph E. Zett, son of John and Trezie Zett, was born in 1889 in Williamson County, Texas, and lived there until his death in 1963. Rudolph Zett's father came to Texas in the late 1800s from Horni Becva, Czechoslovakia, and settled in Williamson County where he bought land near Circleville and Granger.

Rudolph E. Zett had three brothers and two sisters: William, John, Frank, Mrs. Annie Jurecka and

man for the past thirteen years, is one of the pioneer wheat growers of Hansford County and is also well known in the agricultural industry at Erick, Oklahoma, where he lived for thirty-four years prior to locating in the Texas Panhandle. While Mr. Francis has been highly successful in the production of wheat, his best crop was in 1928, when he harvested an average of forty-five bushels to the acre. His farm near Spearman is well improved and equipped with practically every modern device for the planting and harvesting of this staple crop.

G. W. Francis was born in Grayson County, Texas, in 1871, and is a son of H. S. Francis, formerly of Missouri, who came to Texas soon after the close of the Civil War and for many years was a well known and successful planter in North Texas. Mr. Francis was educated in the public schools of his native County and lived there and in Oklahoma until he came to Spearman some years ago.

In 1892 Mr. Francis was married to Mrs. Dela Goff, also a native of Grayson County, and they are the parents of four children, Nora, Ruby, Earl Lee and Mary Ellen Francis. Their son, Earl Lee Francis, is Sheriff-elect of Beckman County, having been chosen to this important position in the Democratic primaries in July, 1938, and had formerly served for two years as County Commissioner.

Mr. Francis is a progressive, enterprising and forward-looking citizen with a keen appreciation of his civic responsibilities and duties. He is also a thoroughly loyal Panhandle booster and one of the most progressive wheat growers in that entire section.

OE ZOTZ, long time rancher and farmer of Windthorst, Texas, came to the state from Germany in 1885, and first settled in Houston. For the next twenty years he farmed in various counties, moving farther North and West from the Gulf, and in 1906 located in Archer County. where he now owns a well improved one thousand acre stock farm. Mr. Zotz raises registered Hereford cattle, good saddle and work horses, and has one of the finest herds of sheep in North Texas. On his cultivated acreage he raises wheat, oats, barley and feed stuff, and keeps his stock well fed and in tip-top shape. His stock farm, located on both sides of Highway 66, just out of Windthorst, is a typical German farm, well cared for, and all buildings kept in perfect condition, being one of the most beautiful places along the highway, and one inviting frequent and favorable comment from passers-by.

Mr. Zotz was born at Landou, Germany, on the twentieth day of October, 1874, and is a son of John George Zotz and Barbara Zotz, the mother passing away in Germany before the family moved to America. During his eleventh year they came to the United States, settling in Houston, and moving subsequently to Colorado, Falls, Limestone, Freestone, then back to Limestone, and finally to Falls County. From there they moved to McLelland, and after a short time to Archer County, Mr. Zotz farming, either with his father, or alone in these various counties.

Mr. Zotz was married in November, 1899, to Miss Mary Kocks, a daughter of A. Kocks, now living and past his eightieth year, and Mary Kocks, deceased. Mr. and Mrs. Zotz have five children: Margaret, Paulina, Alfontz, Gertrude and Leona. They make their home on their stockfarm, near Windthorst. Mr. Zotz belongs to St. Mary's Catholic Church, and is a member of the Knights of Fundamentally an agriculturist and Columbus. stockman, Mr. Zotz finds in the development of his acres both vocation and avocation, and has contributed his full share to the advancement of stockfarming in his community, being especially foremost in advocating modern and progressive methods.

Jack Yarbrough, Sr., cattle and sheep inspector for the Nolan County Cattle and Sheep Growers Association, is one of the best known men in Nolan County where he has lived for a number of years. Mr. Yarbrough, who first came to Nolan County in 1905, is now a resident of the Roscoe community and has his home six miles south of Roscoe. He is an experienced rancher and cattle man and has rendered splendid service to the growers of this county since assuming his duties as inspector on the fifteenth of January, 1936.

A native Texan, Mr. Yarbrough was born in Williamson County on the fourth of September, 1871, a son of W. M. Yarbrough, former hardware merchant, and Ann (Moore) Yarbrough, both of whom are now deceased. Mr. Yarbrough was educated in the public schools of Williamson and Bell Counties and for five years after leaving school worked on a Bell County ranch. Mr. Yarbrough then went to San Angelo County where he continued ranching for several years and then was located in Wyoming and Oklahoma for short periods before coming to Nolan County where he operated a ranch for a year and then traded in cattle until 1914.

From 1914 until 1918 Mr. Yarbrough served as sheriff of Nolan County, then retired and again was engaged in the ranch business for four years. In 1922 he was again elected to the office of sheriff and served for three more terms, making a total of ten years that Mr. Yarbrough filled this important office in Nolan County. After leaving the sheriff's office the last time Mr. Yarbrough was connected with the police department of Sweetwater for several years, operated his own ranch for a while and was manager of the Schultz Brothers ranch for two years.

On the fifth of May, 1905, Mr. Yarbrough was married to Miss Carrie Woodward of Taylor County, a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. W. E. Woodward, Sr. Mr. and Mrs. Yarbrough are the parents of five children, Jack Yarbrough, Jr., is married and the father of two children, Gordaon and Hazel Ann Yarbrough, Bill Yarbrough, the second son, lives at Roscoe; Miss Edna Yarbrough is a student at the College of Industrial Arts at Denton and Bob and Margaret Roscoe are each at home with their parents.

Mr. Yarbrough is a member of various Masonic bodies, including the Shrine, and religious affiliation is with the Baptist Church.

Wallace became a member of the Church of Christ very early in life and lived a Christian life along with his wife and children. He enjoyed and loved his family, grandchildren, great-grandchildren and his many friends. He died 13 November 1972 in Georgetown at the age of eighty-three years, six months. His wife died 1 February 1981. They are both buried in the IOOF Cemetery in Georgetown, Texas.

ELIJAH A. MOORE By Edna Yarbrough

Elijah A. Moore, son of Lewellen Moore (1780-1851) and Priscilla Thornton (1781–1851), was born in South Carolina 7 September 1810. The family moved to Tuscaloosa County, Alabama in 1818 and later to Fayette County in that state. On 13 January 1835 he married Minerva Hobbs (1814-1873), daughter of James Hobbs (1783-1838) and Jerusha Atkinson (1792–1852), in Lowndes County, Mississippi. Thirteen children were born of this marriage: Margaret G. (1835-1836), John William (1837-1916), Sarah P. King (1840-1874), Martha (1842-1858), Tom T. (1844-1861), James Logan (1846-), Margaret Jane Morris (1848-1930), And Eliza Yarbrough (1850-1924), and Lewis; the names of the remaining four children are unknown.

The family resided in Fayette County, Alabama and Lowndes County, Mississippi before moving to Greenwood, Mississippi in the 1850s where they lived during the Civil War. Their son, James Logan, was a soldier in the Confederate Army.

In the late 1860s the family moved to Florence, Texas where Elijah continued to farm and raise cattle; his registered brand was AA. The family belonged to the Florence Baptist Church.

Minerva died 11 June 1873 and is buried in the Florence Cemetery near her brother W. R. Hobbs. Elijah then married Eliza Long (1835–1901), daughter of William H. Long and Ann Carter. They homesteaded a 160 acre tract of public land in Lampasas County, Texas in 1878–1881. He was a Master Mason and a member of the Mount Hiram Lodge No. 595 when it

was organized in Copperas Cove, Texas in 1884. He died 7 July 1897 and is buried near Copperas Cove. Ann Eliza died 30 December 1901 while visiting relatives in Gutherie, Texas and is buried there.

JOHN HENRY MOORE AND MARY RMANTHA "MINT" LEWIS MOORE By Hazel Inez Nelson Bradbury

Mary Rmantha "Mint" Lewis was born 16 February 1858 in Williamson County, Texas, the seventh child of William Lewis, Jr. and Mary Fish Lewis. She married John Henry Moore about 1875. He died October 1881 in Milam County, Texas after being thrown from a horse. He is buried in Cameron, Milam County, Texas. They had two children: Jepthay and Alice Cynthia.

December 8, 1882 in Milam County, Mary "Mint" married her second husband, George Washington Hanks (born 1831), a widower with four children: Peet, Will, Ruth, and Frankie. He was a resident of Ozark, Missouri, when he enlisted in the Civil War, Confederate Army, First Missouri Infantry Regiment, Company "B." He took part in the Battle of Vicksburg; surrendered at Vicksburg, 4 July 1863; came home "starved, cold, and barefoot"; a battered man who told his family, "War is hell!"

George Hanks took his bride and family to Ardmore, Carter County, Oklahoma (Indian Territory). Mary "Mint" drove the covered wagon with all her household goods and two children, while George drove their cattle. They had four more children: Oliver, Virgil, Oma, and Meeker. Mary "Mint" Lewis Moore Hanks died 1 August 1895 at age thirty-seven of a ruptured gall bladder and is buried in Carter County, Oklahoma. George Hanks died 1922, age ninety-one, and is buried next to her.

The first child of John Henry Moore and Mary "Mint" Lewis Moore was Jepthay Cornelius Moore, born 1876; he married Jenney Beavers 7 November 1897, had nine children. The second child was Alice Cynthia Moore, born 9 July 1881. Alice was fourteen years old when her mother "Mint" died. The oldest girl at home, she took over the duties of mother of the house, cooking, cleaning and sewing for the family.

John McDuffy Harris was born 28 January 1876 in Milam County, Texas, parents unknown. They died

and exact dates. It says nothing as to Norman origin, but the very vagueness of the opening tells against that hypothesis.

The next two cases, both Irish, illustrate the very opposite extremes of foreign settlement in Ireland. Alexander Conyngham was the first Protestant minister of Enver and Killymard, in Donegal, and from him descended the Marquesses Conyngham. We need inquire no further. The pedigree begins in 1611. With Ormond, on the other hand, we can truthfully say that 'the history of the illustrious house of Butler of Ormonde is in point of fact the history of Ireland from the time of the Anglo-Norman invasion'. The covered cups of the Butlers are a reminder of the great office they have so long held. The present Marquess of Ormonde is the thirtieth Hereditary Chief Butler of Ireland. The Butlers descend from Hubert Walter, mentioned in the Sheriff's Accounts for cos. Norfolk and Suffolk in 1156.

The Kennedys, Marquesses of Ailsa, being of an ancient Scottish family, do not require the aid of a Norman ancestry, which in the male line at least they probably do not possess. Normanby is a descendant of Phipps. Perhaps Sir Constantine Phipps's name may recall an alliance with the old Constantine family which would give the Phippses Norman blood. With Dufferin and Ava there is an instance of the reverse process from Norman invasion. The Blackwoods, an old Scottish family, supplied through Adam Blackwood, Privy Councillor to Mary, Queen of Scots, a race of seigneurs to France. Carisbrooke is a part of Milford Haven and Mountbatten. Finally there is the Marquess of Aberdeen and Temair, whose Gordon (Earls of Aberdeen) line seems far from propitious to a Norman origin.

Thus out of the thirty-nine cases examined there are only seven where Norman blood can reasonably be assumed in the male line. This is even less than in the ranks of the dukes, although the latter would never have reached their relatively high number but that a number of offshoots of the royal line had been solaced with ducal coronets.

The truth is that in assessing the durability of a stock, the majority of people show quite clearly that they have no conception of the pasage of time, consequently they do not understand that the Norman Conquest is over 900 years from us. During that period the whole composition of our nobility has changed again and again. To understand this it is necessary to know what we mean by the peerage.

YARBROUGH

Properly speaking, there was no peerage until 1295, when the Model Parliament was summoned by Edward 1. Even then the ideas that we associate with peerage took long to develop; for example, one man, spoken of as a member of the Lords, sat in the Commons in the fourteenth century after he had been summoned to the Lords as a peer.

Yet peerage really originated with the idea of nobility. Nobles there have always been in England. Alderman, the Old English aristocratic term, gave way to earl, derived from the Norse jarl. The great Earls, such as Godwin of Wessex and Leofric of Mercia, who ruled large parts of England under Edward the Confessor, were very nearly kings. William the Conqueror, while continuing and developing the system of land tenure in England and maintaining the position of Earl, did not allow his Barons the power possessed by the Old English nobles. 'Baron' was then a generic term which included Earl, and only very much later did it become equivalent as now to the lowest degree in the peerage.

As the country has changed socially, politically and economically, so the peerage has changed with it and as a reflection upon it. For some 200 years the Barons, from whom the subsequent peers were to come, were the chief tenants of the Crown. They were the great landowners. The Crown was viewed, as it is legally to this day, as owning all the land of England and as letting out various portions of it to persons whose task was to counsel the King in peace and follow him in war.

From the time of the Model Parliament of Edward 1 (1295) changes began to occur. In the early thirteenth century advancement into the number of the great lords was no longer dependent upon warlike skill. The growth of state business and the increase in the commerce of the nation brought new types of peers into the ranks of the nobility.

The most interesting example of this is the case of De la Pole. William, the founder of this family, was a wealthy increhant of Kingston-upon-Hull. His elder son, another William, was, like his father, a merchant of Hull, and mayor of the borough. He undertook to provision the army of Edward 111 when in Scotland, with wine, salt and other necessities. Part of the cargo was lost in being conveyed to

Berwick on Tweed, but William de la Pole did not bear the loss but had an allowance from the Exchequer. In short, he was a war contractor, and his son, Michael, while keeping a firm grip on the family business, showed a taste for military service. In 1366 he was a Baron by writ of summons to Parliament. In 1385 he was created Earl of Suffolk by letters patent. Thus within one lifetime of seventy years this family had passed from the position of ordinary citizen to the front rank of nobility.

A son of a Baron who had been summoned to Parliament usually received a summons in his turn, but the use of the (then) new procedure of creating a peer by letters patent made the recipient independent of the hazards of summons. His peerage passed to his heirs without more trouble. The De la Poles became later (in 1448) Dukes of Suffolk, and

ranked in popular estimation among the highest nobility.

The truth is that a study of the peerage reveals not a close fenced ring of notables, like the grandees of old Spain, mortally afraid lest some plebeian should breathe on them; but a reward for merit, to be earned by brains, character, hard work and good luck. In the days of self-help and industry, the poor young man could hope one day to wear a coronet, earned by his outstanding qualities and conferred by his Sovereign. Ambition was no crime, and a Nuffield or a Lyle or Hives only followed in the track of the industrious apprentice of eight centuries back. The founder of the family of the Dukes of Leeds saved his master's daughter from the Thames and so obtained the first step on the road to wealth. The first recorded ancestor of the great house of Knollys (Viscount) was a tailor.

It was clear that a nobility recruited in this manner is not likely to have much recorded Norman pedigree. The mortality among title-holders has ever been very great, and there has always been the necessity of creating fresh peers. Equally, of course, there are families which, once of great Norman power, have climbed back to the modern equivalent of the old baronial status. An instance of this is to be found

in the case of Earl Wavell.

The line of descent of the Wavells is traced from John Wavell, who bought the manor of Atherfield in Brigstone, in the Isle of Wight, from Sir Thomas Frenchard before 1592. For four centuries the Wavells' descent is traced from father to son, and one of the outstanding features of the pedigree is the distinction achieved in nearly every generation. The present Earl Wavell is the second of his line. His father was, of

course, the famous general, the conqueror of Graziani, who gave us victory in our darkest hour and was afterwards Viceroy of India. Lord Wavell's grandfather was a Major-General and a CB; his great-grandfather, Arthur Goodall Wavell, served in the Peninsular War and was awarded two knighthoods by Charles III of Spain. Later he achieved the rank of Major-General in the Independence Armies of Chile and Mexico, receiving also from the Mexican Government a grant of a large part of what is now Texas. Farther back in the pedigree we have William Wavell, MD, FRS, after whom the element wavellite is named. His father was the Rev. Richard Wavell, a celebrated nonconformist minister of the seventeenth century.

The tale of Wavell distinction does not end there. For nearly four and a half centuries Wavells have been scholars of Winchester, which is the reason for a Winchester scholar being a supporter in the Earl's coat of arms. Also in the Earl's achievement are six martlets (birds without feet), a reminder of the earlier knightly Wavells from whom assuredly the present line descend. These medieval Wavells lived in Sussex, which has martlets as the main charge in the county shield. Like all other English surnames, Wavell has undergone various changes before it settled into its present form. The variants of the name can all be traced to an origin in the village of Vauville, which stands on the bay of the same name in the western portion of the Cherbourg peninsula. The Seigneurs of Vauville were a younger branch of the Barons of Briquebec who, like many others of the ruling cast in Normandy, were descended from the old Norse stock. A William de Vauville or Wavilla is mentioned in charters in both Normandy and England in the eleventh century. In the reign of John, Sir Richard de Vauville (Wauvill) settled in Sussex, and during the period 1200-1400 the Wavells are to be found in Bedfordshire and Somerset also, for the most part as holders of knights' fees. It was at the close of the Middle Ages that the family settled in the Isle of Wight.

The pedigree of these earlier Norman Wavells has been traced generation by generation, from about 1035 to 1413, by a cousin of the late Earl, Mr Edward Wavell. Much of the information abut the earlier Wavells has been gleaned from Norman sources, the Archives de la Manche, the Cartularies of various Abbeys, and a contemporary Norman priest, the Abbé Noel Langlois. From these sources we note that the Wavells in the Middle Ages were men of distinction, mostly

knights. Richard Wavill, the last of the Sussex line, was MP for the county. Parallel with this Sussex line from 1300 to 1400 was another branch which held land in the Isle of Wight, Roger Wavill was a witness to a charter at Afton there in 1300. A century later Adam Wavill was witness to a grant of land at the same place. There is no need for undue scepticism when it is suggested that the Wavell of 1592 may well have been the descendant of this line.

If in the Wavell case there is good reason to identify the earlier bearers of the name with later holders of it, with the Pakenhams, Earls of Longford, the position is not so clear. The Pakenham pedigree is one of the longest in the whole peerage. About the year 1100 the ancestors of the family were holding the manor of Netherhall in Pakenham in Suffolk as vassals of the Abbey of Bury St Edmunds, and about this time the church was founded by Walter, who had no surname. Walter's grandson Anselm (a bastard, by the way) succeeded in securing the manor of Pakenham and excluding his father's sisters. Anselm's son was the first to call himself Pakenham - Robert de Pakenham in the usage of the time. Thus the surname of the Earls of Longford is taken. like that of most old English families, from their ancient habitation. Certainly the Christian names of the family from the earliest traceable period are foreign - Walter, Peter, Anselm, etc. - but this is a generation after the Conquest, and who knows whether Walter was the son of Lcofwine? In any event the Pakenhams were under-tenants at the beginning of the twelfth century, a fact agreeable to an English origin.

Very few Earls can trace a descent from an actual Domesday Book tenant. One who can is our premier Earl, Shrewsbury. The great house of Talbot stems, in England, from Richard Talbot, who is mentioned in Domesday Book as holding nine hides of land from Walter Giffard, Earl of Buckingham. Another Geoffrey Talbot or Talebot was an undertenant of Hugh de Gournay in Essex. The name is not a place-name, so it is impossible to affix the origin of the Talbots to a particular place in Normandy; but there is evidence that they held lands in the Department of Seine Inferieure, being the under-tenants of Giffard, Count of Eu, and of Gournay. In England we find Richard Talbot, the founder of the English line, marrying the daughter of Gerard de Gournay, Baron of Yarmouth. It is a confirmation of a family's Norman origin to note the same lord-and-vassal relationship manifesting itself on both sides of the Channel. Although we cannot show the actual descent of

the Talbot lineage from the Norman Talbots (in Normandy) we can be sure that it exists because of these confirmatory facts. For example, Richard Talbot's son, Hugh, was, according to Ordericus Vitalis, made Governor of the Castle of Plessis, in Normandy, by his uncle, Hugh de Gournay, in 1118, so that the Gournay connection is again clear.

The first Earl of Shrewsbury was the famous Sir John Tallot who had William Shakespeare for his chronicler (in his struggle with the Maid, Joan of Arc), though Sir Bernard Burke was hardly less eloquent than the poet. 'After this, he went once more to fight in France. He commanded a fleet, landed and took Falaise, and as Lieutenant of the Duchy of Aquitaine marched to the south, and made Bordeaux surrender and the surrounding minor towns send in instant submission. He thence advanced to the relief of Chastillon and met the besieging French army commanded by their then greatest leader, Dunois, Bastard of Orleans. In the battle which ensued, 20 July 1453, Talbot, in the sixty-third year of his age, received a wound in the thigh which proved immediately mortal. He had been victorious in forty different battles and dangerous skirmishes; his death proved fatal to the English dominion in France, which never flourished afterwards. 'Hundreds he sent to hell' (Shakespeare). 'The very name of Talbot became a terror to Frenchmen' (Burke). This great personage was appointed Lord High Steward of Ireland, a post which has remained in his family. Here, then, we have another great office of State held in this instance by a Norman-descended line. Another inheritance from ancient times carried by the Talbots is a curious bone structure of some of their fingers. It has been proved by an examination of the first Earl's body that 600 years ago this feature was present in the family as it is now.

Another Norman house of great note is that of Curzon, which is now represented in the peerage by Viscount Scarsdale of Kedleston. The surest possible testimony exists in so far as the lands of Kedleston in Derbyshire have been in the possession of a Curzon for a period of at least 800 years. In the College of Arms the Curzon pedigree in the Visitation of Derbyshire in 1611 goes back in a connected line to the reign of Henry VI (1422-7). The earliest in the collection of heraldic doodlings was a grant of Kedleston from one Curzon to another. This deed is now preserved in Lord Scarsdale's muniment room. In any event the name of Curzon is definitely identified with Notre Dame de Curson, near Calvados, arr. Lisieux, cant. Livarot. The first Curzon of

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whom there is record (in the Domesday Book, 1086), was Hubert, who held West Lockinge, Berkshire, of Henry de Ferrers, the great Earl of Derby. Again in 1135 another Hubert de Curcun held three knights' fees of the honours of Ferres; Stephen de Curcun, described as ne pos of Hubert, held two of these fees in 1166, Courson was part of the Norman barony of Ferrieres and in 1223 Hubert de Courson was seigneur of Courson. The arms of the Norman line have the popinjays or parrots of the Curzons of Kedleston, a fact which proves either the existence of these arms at the Conquest, a view contrary to all heraldic knowledge. or that there was a much closer intercourse between England and Normandy in the twelfth century than is supposed.

The Ferrers, who have been mentioned several times, were among the tenants in capite of the Crown, but they have long ceased to hold the Earldom of Derby. The title of Ferrers is now held by the Shirleys, Earls Ferrers, who were once tenants of the former race. Henry, ancestor of Earl Ferrers, held five knights' fees in Derbyshire of Robert de Ferrers, Earl of Derby, in 1165. The family of which Henry was ancestor took the name of Shirley from the place of that name. They are, perhaps, the only family in England today who still own property held by their ancestor in the Domesday Survey. This ancestor was Sewallis, the great-grandfather of Henry mentioned above. Shirley, the historian of the family, in his well-known book, Noble and Gentle Men of England, held that the name of Sewallis or Saswalo argued this forbear to be of the old Saxon stock. This is not conclusive, but we must respectfully state that, as in the history of so many other families, we , do not know whether the Shirleys are of Norman or Saxon origin. If it be correct that Saswalo is a name found in Continental Archives before 1066 then the probability is that Sewallis was of foreign stock. On the other hand, the fact that he held large estates in 1086 is not proof that he was of Norman blood: Thurkill the ancestor of that undoubtedly Saxon family, the Ardens, was a large landowner in the same survey.

The Shirleys, incidentally, have the distinction of having provided almost the only Earl who has swung at Tyburn in a silken halter. The fourth Earl was convicted of murder - but why try to better perfection? Let Burke tell the story in his inimitable early Victorian prose. 'Although not bereft of intellect, this nobleman frequently evinced strong symptoms of a constitutional violence of temper; and in one

of the paroxysms of rage habitual to him, his Lordship put to death his own confidential land steward, an aged gentleman of the name of Johnson, in January, 1760, for which offence he was condemned to suffer death, and was executed accordingly at Tyburn 5 May following.' The gentle Norman blood did not run cold then.

If the Shirleys have the Ferrers surname as their title, the title of the Ferrers has passed to the Stanleys, the Earls of Derby. All that we know of the Stanley pedigree is contained in a short compass. Adam de Stanley (another place-name), brother of Liulf de Audley (who was father of Adam de Audley), was living in the time of Stephen and Henry 11. The Stanleys were apparently the cousins of the Audleys, and the son of Adam, William, was granted Stanley in Staffordshire by Adam de Audley (another place-name). Unless Liulf is a foreign name there is little likelihood of this family being Norman or French. Whether this be so or not the history of the Stanleys is instructive for the study of the peerage. Many generations were to pass before the Stanleys were to be reckoned among the great nobles; but in the reign of Henry IV, Sir John Stanley, Knight of the Garter and Lord of the Isle of Man, was one of the greatest magnates of the realm.

Does nothing remain then of the once mighty house of Ferrers, save their name and titles appropriated by alien bloods? The Norman line in the motherland continued until the early sixteenth century, but in England they have gone long before. Possibly something is left. Names have undergone such curious changes that Farrow may well be derived from Ferrers. Indeed, we know from a pedigree recorded in the College of Arms recently that it is so. The pedigree is that of John Villiers Farrow, of Beverley Hills, California, Commander in the Royal Canadian Navy (Res.), Lord of the Manor of Surlingham, Norfolk. Of this family history Burke's Landed Gentry (1952 edition) says on information supplied by Sir Anthony Wagner (now Sir Anthony Wagner - Garter King of Arms):

'The pedigree of this family recorded in the College of Arms begins with Nicholas Ferrour, mentioned in 1500, but though a connected descent can at present be proved no further, a highly probable ancestry from a much earlier date can be indicated.

ELIAS DE FERRERS, whose origin is unknown but who may have been akin to the Earls of Derby (see FERRERS of Baddesley Clinton), was a

party to a fine in Rudham, Norfolk, with his brother Eustace in 1208. He had issue,

HENRY DE FERRERS, of whom Martin de Pateshill, Archdeacon of Norfolk, 1226-8, held land in West Rudham, which he granted to Coxford Priory. He appears to have been enfeoffed c. 1234 of a quarter of a knight's fee in Rudham held of the Fitzwalters. This remained in the Ferrers family till it passed by marriage before 1428 to John Bachelor with his wife, Isabel, dau. and heir. of Thomas Ferrers.

EDMUND DE FERRERS held this quarter fee in 1302, John DE FERRERS in 1346 and others of the name are found at West Rudham in the 14th cent.

'JOHN FEROUR, probably a scion of this family and the first of the name connected with Guist, Norfolk, is mentioned in a lawsuit of 1383 (De Banco Roll). Three brothers, RICHARD, JOHN, and WILLIAM, mentioned at the same time, were perhaps his sons. NICHOLAS FERROUR, of Guist, is mentioned in 1430, and may have been the father of the Nicholas with whom the proved pedigree begins.'

The reference in this extract to the Ferrers of Baddesley Clinton reminds us that nearer home, in the person of Cecil Ralph Ferrers, we have a representative of this ancient house. He has disposed, however, of the greater part of the old Baddesley Clinton Estate, though he remains Lord of the Manor.

John Villiers Farrow is a well-known Hollywood producer. His wife is the famous actress, Maureen O'Sullivan, the daughter of Major Charles John O' Sullivan, Connaught Rangers, of Saintbury, Killiney, co. Dublin. They have seven children, seven scions of the old Norman stock. It may seem a far cry from the days of Norman chivalry to filmproducing in Hollywood, but there is nothing intrinsically curious about it. Blood will flow, and other members of the film colony can make the same claim.

Olivia de Havilland and her sister Joan Fontaine are members of the ancient family of which in England the late Captain Sir Geoffrey de Havilland was head. Sir Geoffrey was Director and Designer of the then De Havilland Aircraft Co. Ltd., and a Fellow of the R Ae Society. The knights of old have taken to the air. The Guernsey family of De Havilland derives its name from the fiefs of Haverland, situated

near Valogne in Normandy, where they were lords in 1050. They settled in Guernsey as early as 1176, but the manner of their settlement in England is even more interesting. Thomas, Seigneur de Havilland, fought at the siege of Mount Orgueil Castle, Jersey, in 1467. As a reward for his services he received a patent conferring certain commercial privileges, and to avail himself of these he established his second son, James, at Poole in Dorset, where he became Mayor in 1494. The present De Havilland line descends from James's elder brother, Thomas, but a branch, the Havellands of Wilkswood House,

It should be emphasized that there are several ancient Channel Island families whose descent runs back to Conquest times. In the midthirteenth century, there is mention of the Marquand family, of which the former Socialist Minister of Pensions, Hilary Marquand, is a member. In a direct line they are traceable to 1540, when two brothers, Jean and Pierre Marchand, married respectively Michelle Renouf and Judith Heron. On the Marquand pedigree* is the following note: 'In posession of the Marquand family there is an agreement of Raoul (Ralph) Marquand to make a gift of land about 144 acres dated November 1244, with a note, copied from the original Archives of the Channel Islands with the impression of the sign of Raoul Marquand, Legend, Seal of Ralph Marquand. The relationship between Ralph 1244 and this 1540 descendant cannot be reconciled owing to the time lapse at the date when this record was collated.'

Seven hundred years is a long time to have records of one's family, but this is easily surpassed by the Baron de Saumarez (pronounced Sommeries). Of this line Burke remarks: 'The family of Sausmarez or Saumarez descends from the Norman family of St Hilaire du Harcourt, which held a castle built by William the Conqueror on the borders of Brittany. The name, which has also been spelt Sausmarais, Samares, and Sameresq, was derived from the Fief de Saumareys, i.e. salt marsh, situated in low-lying land by the sea in the parish of St Glement, Jersey, which is said to have been given to Ralph de St Hilaire, by William Rufus in 1096. The Latin forms Salinelles and de Salso Marisco were in use in the twelfth and thirteenth centuries. The family disappeared from Jersey in 1333 on forseiture of its estates in that Island.

'GUILLAUME DE SALINELLES is mentioned in 1180, his son in • In author's possession.

1221 and his grandson in 1221 and 1254; each bore the same name and title, and were Seigneurs of Saumareys. The last of these, who became a Knight, resumed the name of Samerais, together with his younger brothers, Nicholas and Ralph. Sir William was a man of considerable importance in the Channel Islands, and was appointed Justice of Assize on two occasions by Henry III and Edward I.' The present peer descends from Nicholas, the brother of Sausmarez.

Other cases of Norman descent of the Channel Island families will come for consideration under the chapters on the Baronetage and Landed Gentry. The division is not unfair, because the Channel Islands were part of the Norman homeland and their present representative families can be treated as resembling the colonizing portion of their people. Indeed, to this day the Islanders are said to regard themselves as England's conquerors. The idea still lingers, outside as well as within the Islands, that they remain in some way the Duchy of Normandy. We can forget this. The Sovereign is not Duke of Normandy. The title was renounced formally after King John was driven out of Normandy in 1204. The Channel Islands are an appanage of the British Crown; a relic of former European possessions but not the old Norman duchy in miniature.

To return to our examination of relics of Normanity among the peers, the old Deramore pedigree formerly began with the words 'The family of Yarburgh (the peer's family name is Yarburgh-Bateson) is one of great antiquity. At the time of the Norman Conquest, Eustachius de Yarburgh was Lord of Yarburgh, in Lincolnshire, which manor, etc., still remains vested in the Lords Deramore.' After this lofty beginning we come down to a plain and correct account, from which it is perfeetly clear that this fine old family derives both name and origin from Yarburgh. Its first impetus on the road to fame was given by a good Tudor lawyer, Edmund Yarburgh, for whom is claimed lineal descent from the said Eustachius de Yarburgh. This same Eustachius was wont formerly to appear in the family tree of Lord Alvingham, whose surname is Yerburgh and whose Yerburgh arms are the same as Lord Deramore's Yarburgh arms.

Eustachius has to join that band of mighty Normans, puissant Saxons and regal Welshmen whose existences can at the best be conceded to have been possible. Such a one was Tudor Trevor, Welsh Earl of Hereford before the Conquest. How comes it that the Trevors of Trawscoed

bear his name? There is always an eponymous at the beginning of every tribe, but it does not follow that he really lived.

Lord Alvingham's pedigree is traced from one Germund, who was enfeoffed of lands at Grainthorpe, co. Lincoln, and of the advowson of the church there by Alain, Count of Brittany, 1084-1112. This man Germund, of whose antecedents and race we know nothing (though there was a pre-Conquest Germund in Lincolnshire, which bodes ill for Norman pedigrees), was the common ancestor of both Deramore and Alvingham. If Germund was of Saxon origin, then the superfluous introduction of Eustachius was another of those clumsy half-conscious attempts to provide a combination of Saxon and Norman ancestry.

A family of great distinction which may well have a Norman origin is that of Keyes, the peerage of which was conferred on the very gallant and successful seaman, Admiral of the Fleet Sir Roger Keyes, whose immortal exploits in the Dover patrol and at Zeebrugge are memorialized in the full peerage title - Keyes of Zeebrugge and of Dover. This family was formerly thought to descend from a settler in Ireland, John Keyes, who went there in the reign of James 1 or was taken by his father at the end of the Tudor period. The brother of the first Baron, Sir Terence Humphreys, himself a distinguished soldier, became interested in the genealogy of the family. He traced the Keyes family to Thomas Keyes, Sergeant Porter at the Court of Queen Elizabeth 1. Thomas Keyes is usually wrongly named as Martin Keyes in the reference books, but his story as there told is not incorrect in the main. He was the biggest man at Elizabeth's Court, and after many years' service (he had first been taken into Court life by Henry VIII) he presumed upon his favoured position, and a slight cousinship to Gloriana, to marry Lady Mary Grey, who stood in the line of succession to the throne. Elizabeth never cared for marriage on the part of any persons near her, male or female; marriage with one of her possible heirs caused a furious outburst. She would never help a Keyes bastard to her throne. Keyes fell into disgrace, and this probably contributed to the depression of the family. Before him, however, the Keyes had a fine record of service; his father had built Sandgate Castle for Henry VIII and been its first Captain, and the family descended collaterally from Roger Keyes, a priest who helped to build All Souls at Oxford for Archbishop Chichele and to complete Eton School for Henry vi. The grant of arms from King Henry to Roger Keyes and to

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A family of immense antiquity whose racial origin cannot be definitely established is that of the Earls of Scarbrough, the Lumleys. Their surname is taken from Lumley on the Weare in the Bishopric of Durham. The earliest mention of the name is that of Robert de Lumeley, in 1133-44 and others mentioned are Uchtred de Lumley and Osbern de Lumeleie. A connected line of descent is traceable from about 1250 but it is certain that for several generations before that time Lumley had been held by the same family.

So far our examination of peerage families has revealed few with Norman blood, but we have discovered several Norman lines in places where we should not perhaps have expected to find them. There is, of course, a conspicuous absence of gallant Norman forbears on the field of Hastings. About a hundred years ago hardly any family of consequence but claimed its origin from one of William's knights.

In the preface to the first edition of Burke's Landed Gentry (then. in 1836-7, published under the proud title of Burke's Commoners). John Burke remarked that 'in these pages will be found the lineage of nearly 400 families enjoying in the aggregate probably a revenue of two millions sterling, and deriving many of them their territorial possessions from William of Normandy'. Time has greatly increased and democratized the number of families in Burke, the economic exigencies of our bitter age have reduced their sterling income, and worst of all, the work of scholars like E. A. Freeman, John Horace Round and Oswald Barron has emasculated the majority of claims by aristocratic families to Norman ancestry. In particular Round was as fierce after 'Tales of the Conquest', as he called them, as a ferret after rabbits.

In due course, by careful examination of documents of the Conquest period, it has been possible to draw up a list of those persons who are known from contemporary sources to have been with William in his expedition in 1066 and who were present at Hastings. For this list I

would refer to a lecture given on 10 May 1944, by Geoffrey H. White, to the Society of Genealogists and printed in the Society's magazine. Mr White drew upon the researches of Professor David Douglas of Bristol University and upon his own work.

The list is interesting as showing the names of Companions of the Conqueror which scholars have been able to find. The sources of the names are (1) William of Poitiers, who had been a member of William's household (he was not at the battle); (2) Orderic Vitalis, who was born about 1075; (3) a Latin poem describing the battle of Hastings, said to have been written by Guy, Bishop of Amiens, and (4) the charters of the Holy Trinity of Rouen and other places. This list was not put forward by the authors (nor is it by me now) as sacrosanct or unalterable. It is possible that it can be extended, but the fact remains that only twenty-five names are given derived from these reliable sources. These names are:

Robert de Beaumont, son and heir of Roger de Beaumont, later Earl of Leicester, a cousin of the Conqueror.

Eustace, Count of Boulogne.

William, afterwards third Count of Evreux.

Geoffrey of Mortagne, afterwards Count of Perche.

William FitzOsbern, afterwards Earl of Hereford.

Aimery, Vicomte of Thouars.

Hugh de Montford, Lord of Montfort-sur-Risle.

Walter Giffard, Lord of Longueville.

Ralf de Toeni, Lord of Conches.

Hugh de Grandmesnil, Lord of Grandmesnil.

William de Warenne, afterwards Earl of Surrey.

William Malet, Lord of Graville.

Odo, Bishop of Bayeux, half-brother of the Conqueror.

Geoffrey de Mowbray, Bishop of Coutances.

Robert, Count of Mortain, afterwards Earl of Cornwall.

Wadard.

Vital.

Turstin Fitz Rou, who bore the Conqueror's banner and probably held lands in the Welsh Marches.

Eugenulf de Laigle, killed at Hastings (son of Foubert de Beine) and succeeded by his son Richer de Laigle (slain in 1084), whose issue held lordship of Pevensey. The surname was Latinized to de Aquila.

Goubert d'Auffay, who returned to Normandy after the Conquest.

Robert de Vitot, who died soon after the Conquest. Roger, son of Turold, who died in 1066. Gerelm, brother of Ogerde Panilleuse, who died in England. Erchembald, son of Erchembald the Vicomte. Robert FitzErneis, killed between 1066 and 1083.

To this list I would add the name of Adelolf de Merc, ancestor of the Marris family. Details regarding Adelolf can be read in 'The Lords of Ardres', by J. H. Round (Feudal England [1909], p. 462). Apart from Adelolf, of the men whose names are mentioned above few have left families descending from them in the male line who can prove their ancestry. There are the Giffards and the Malets in the Landed Gentry and the Gresleys of Drakelowe baronets, from Ralf de Toeni.

Thus, as I have stated in my first chapter, the Norman ancestry must be sought, if it exists at all, not in the first rush of the Conquest but in the generation after 1086, when the land had been pacified and stabilized. If all those whose names are put forward as Companions of the Conqueror by their alleged descendants had really been present at Hastings, there would have been truth in the old Norman fiction that Harold nearly fainted for fear as he saw the Norman masses coming over Telham Hill, and one would have to admire his courage in fighting at all. Turstin Fitz Rou has long since had the Conqueror's banner wrenched from his hand by a score of mythical standard-bearers. The number of squires and other personal attendants on William forces one to think little of him and his own exertions in the battle. The first Loring who bore the Conqueror's shield at Senlac' is good stuff in Conan Doyle's Sir Nigel, but has no place in serious studies.

To my knowledge there is not a member of the British peerage who can show a male line descent from any man in the above list. The Gresley baronets of Drakelowe in Derbyshire, a most illustrious house, descend from Ralf de Toeni, but this is a solitary case in the Baronet-

An example of the second-generation Norman, to use a phrase of our American allies, is found in the ancestor of Lord Sackville. We have no means of knowing whether Herbrand de Sauqueville was present at the battle of Hastings, but by 1074 we find Herbrand holding land in England. This was not Knole, the family's famous seat, which did not come into Sackville possession until the reign of Elizabeth 1. Not only did a Sackville hold land in England eight years after Hastings, but the name is undoubtedly derived from Sauqueville, Seine Inf. arr. Dieppe, cant. Offranville. Again, in the Great Survey of 1166, carried out on Henry 11's orders, we have William de Saukeville holding one knight's fee of the Giffards, Earls of Buckingham.

For some reason that has not been adequately explained the Sackvilles do not usually figure among the families of Norman origin. With the exception of the great history of the family published in 1930 and written by Charles J. Phillips* and with that of a book of poems by Thomas Sackville, first Earl of Dorset, I have never seen the tree of the family deduced from Norman times. In Burke's Peerage, for instance, the family used to begin starkly with Sir Richard Sackville, KT, Member of the Privy Council in the reigns of Mary 1 and Elizabeth 1, just as though the Sackvilles were a race of jumped-up Renaissance nobility grown rich on Abbey lands. They had their share of these, like all noble families of the time, but they had five centuries of nobility behind them before the Dissolution of the Monasteries (1536). At Knole, their wonder home in Kent, is a large roller pedigree, probably a production of the period about 1600, when these vast pieces of workmanship were often prepared for the greater nobility by the new race of heralds, such as William Camden. The Piggotts of Doddershall have one, as we shall note, so has Lord Cardigan, besides the one at Knole. The family of the late Dr Kynaston Williams own a mighty sixteenthcentury roller pedigree, going back into dim ages, but this is Welsh genealogy, where princes take the place of mere nobles.

Also at Knole, in the beautiful Charles I billiard-room, is a stainedglass window which purports to show the martial features and stout mailed form of the original Herbrand, 'qui venit in Anglia cum Gulielmo Conquistore'. I am sure that many people who think that claims to Norman descent are all nonsense (as most of them are) have dismissed the subject of the window as mere Elizabethan or Jacobean fiction. Knole was an appendage originally of the Archbishops of Canterbury, but passed to the Sackvilles, who made the house the most splendid representative of a great lord's home that still exists. Herbrand in his window is no fiction. He is the fitting start to a great line which has held many titles in its time. What he must think as he looks down from his height upon the sightseers whom the National Trust guides conduct so ably round the house, I cannot think; but when they

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Searching for Indexed Terms¹

First, find the name or phrase (search term) in the index. Then, from the menu bar, select "Edit", and then "Find" or press CTRL+F. A search field will appear in the upper right corner of the page. Enter the search term into this field and press ENTER. If the search term is not found, nothing will happen; otherwise, the search term will be displayed on the first page in which it occurs. Repeated pressing of the ENTER key will high-light other occurrences within the file. Use the left and right arrow buttons to the right of the search field to look ahead or to look backwards for other occurrences of the term in the document
