

It's early days so far, but with a bit of luck and good timing, we hope to have our family conference in October. Although it was disappointing to have to cancel the conference last year, it has actually been a wise decision. This year will mark another decade since the YNGHA first met to commemorate the resting place of our

earliest ancestor here in the New World. In spite of the uncertainties, it now seems that we will be able to host the conference this year.

We still do not know as much about Old Richard Yarborough's origins as we would like. Hopefully, our DNA Project will eventually provide additional knowledge about Old Richard and his antecedents, and just maybe, show a bit more about his relationship(s) with other extant Yarbroughs of his times.

- While it may not appear obvious, the past decade has seen considerable progress. Our membership is up to near its peak levels;
- We have an active FaceBook group, from which we continue to draw family association members;
- We have completed the digitization of 171 volumes of family records, as well digitization of all our past family journals.
- Contributions of family records are on the increase.
- While we are still learning to use virtual meeting technology, we can at least have face-to-face meetings.

While reviewing some past issues of the Quarterly, I realized that while we had focused on the Joshua Yarborough line, particularly that portion related to Joshua III's son Uriah, not much attention had been given to Uriah's brother Green Berry (of Greenbury, Greenberry, etc.) Uriah's family left Georgia for Alabama circa 1854, and Green Berry and his family decamped to Duval County, Florida. So, this issue is focused on Green Berry's family.

Sadly we lost two of our family – Madison Yarbrough and Jack Singlaub – and they will be missed. Nevertheless, we have much for which to be thankful.

A Matter of Perspective¹

Leonard Yarbrough

Our records trace our family back to 854 CE, and while reviewing some of the records, I thought of taking a look at the population figures (estimates, actually). The table below resulted from my search:

1260	60,000	1,700
1492	68,500	2,100

Of course, it is doubtful that Thomas Malthus would be surprised, as the chart from which this table was constructed predicted just the kind of exponential growth he propounded. There are a few observations of interest. First, prior to and immediately following the arrival of William the Conqueror in Great Britain, the western world consisted of little more than various tribes who spent most of their time fighting each other.

Second, by the time of the Tea Party, the likelihood of the American Revolution being successful was slim to none. Had England not been otherwise chasing after Spain and France, we would still be subjects of the British Monarch.

Finally, it's not too many generations back before the gene pool for our ancestors drops to finite, manageable size. Considering the mortality rates for the years prior to 1900, collectively we had to descend from some very hardy people (who probably were also very lucky).

Joshua Yarborough I

While reviewing several of the back issues, it seemed that not much had been published about the lineage of Green Berry Yarborough, a son of Joshua's grandson Joshua III. Cy Yarborough, in his book <u>Southern Journeys</u>, <u>Descendants of Joshua Yarborough</u>, provides a thorough treatment of the Joshua line, and it is from that source that this and the following history of Green Berry Yarborough are taken.



Green Berry Yarborough

Most of our families immigrated westward through the Carolinas, thence across Georgia, Alabama, Mississippi and further. Green Berry, however, decamped for Florida, settling in Duval County (Jacksonville and environs). Many of his descendants remain in this general area, whereas the remainder of his family eventually settled in Arkansas, Oklahoma and Texas.

Born ca. 1800 in Mecklenburg Co., North Carolina, his name has several spelling variations. Greenberry spelled as one word is the most popular spelling of his name, however, I have a copy of a letter that was written by Green Berry in 1858 whereby he signed the letter "G. B." Yarborough. If he signed the letter in that manner using two distinct initials for his name, it would appear to me that his actual name is Green Berry, two words, instead of Greenberry or Greenbury which I have also seen which in either case is one word. Green Berry is the second child of Joshua Yarborough III. He moved as a boy with his parents and siblings to Chester Co., South Carolina where he grew to adulthood. Green Berry farmed in Chester Co. and in the early I 820's married Mary "Polly" McCalla. "Polly" was born ca. 1797, the daughter of James and Mary McCalla. The first recorded document of Green Berry obtaining land in Chester Co. on 12/17/1827, whereby Green Berry purchased 19 acres from Pressly T. Clack on Mill Creek, a branch of Turkey Creek for the sum of \$30. The transaction was witnessed by his father Joshua Yarborough. On 06/04/1828 Green Berry and his wife Polly are mentioned in the will of her father James McCaulley (McCalla), whereby they receive one dollar as they had already received their part of her father's estate. On 09/05/1828, Green Berry sells the 19 acres he had purchased the previous year (it had since been surveyed and found to be 20 acres) to Col. Greenberry Colvin for the sum of \$50, making a nice profit. On 08/13/1831 Green Berry purchases 67 acres of land in Chester Co. from William L. Wallace, executor of the estate of Thomas Wallace. The land laid on the headwaters of McCarty's branch. His brother Uriah was a witness and also proved the deed. For the next fourteen years Green Berry does not appear to be involved in any land transactions other than as a witness. He does appear in both the 1830 and 1840 U. S. census for Chester Co., S. C. On 11/08/1845 Green Berry sells to Sample Alexander 67 acres on headwaters of McCartey's Branch in Chester Co. for the sum of \$225. The deed was recorded in Chester Co. court in January of 1848. That was the last record of Green Berry Yarborough being in Chester Co., South Carolina.

The next document in which I have been able to find Green Berry is the 1850 U. S. census for Jackson Co., Florida. I do not know the exact date Green Berry and his family arrived in Jackson Co., but it appears that they arrived there by 1847 or 1848 as one of his daughters married there around that time. I cannot speculate as to why Green Berry chose to move to Jackson Co.,

Florida. As far as I know he had no relatives there. Most of his family had moved to Campbell Co., Georgia except for his brother Uriah who remained in Chester Co., S. C. along with him but died less then a year after Green Berry sold his land in Chester Co. Nevertheless, within a year of the 1850 census we find Green Berry buying land in Jackson Co., Florida. On 02/09/ I 851 he buys 39.94 acres. On 12/18/1852 he buys an additional 39.90 acres. On 07/26/1853 he buys another 40.01 acres and on 01/17/1854 an additional 39.78 acres. Finally on 08/02/1854 he buys 159 acres to bring the total to nearly 280 acres.

Green Berry continued to farm his land through the l 850's and all his daughters were married by the end of that decade. The decade of the l860's started off bad for Green Berry as his wife "Polly" is listed in the 1860 Florida Mortality Schedule as having died in January of 1860. I do not know where she was buried. Things continued to go downhill for him as all his sons left home to join the Confederate forces during the Civil War. By the time the Civil War was over Green Berry was an old man. He was listed in the 1860 and 1870 U.S. census for Jackson Co., Florida and he continued to farm.

Unfortunately, I can no longer find my source but my recollection is that Green Berry was listed in the 1880 U. S. census for Jackson Co., Florida living with a relative that I now cannot identify. My recollection is that the census indicated that he was sick and disabled. For that reason, I believe Green Berry probably died ca. 1880 as he would have been approximately 80 years of age at that time. I have no information on the exact date of his death or where he is buried. There have been some extensive surveys on the cemeteries of Jackson Co., Florida and I have found none that has a grave marker for either Green Berry or his wife. My guess is that they were buried in an unmarked grave somewhere near where they lived. Green Berry and his wife "Polly" had eight children.

a. ALMIRA OR ELMIRA YARBOROUGH (BAXTER)- Born 07/05/1824 in Chester Co., South Carolina, she was raised in Chester Co., and moved with her family as a young woman to Jackson Co., Florida. There she met and married Solomon Baxter on 12/18/1850 in Jackson Co., Florida. Solomon was born 11/03/1822 in Jackson Co., Florida, the son of James Oliver and Sarah Futch Baxter. There is some dispute concerning Solomon's date of birth. The

date I have listed above was from researchers of the Baxter family, however, his grave marker has his date of birth as 11/03/1827. I do not know which is correct. This family can be found in the 1860 U. S. census for Jackson Co., Florida. Solomon was a slave owner and is listed as having one slave in 1860. I have been unable to find any records that connect Solomon to military service in the Civil War. Sometime between the 1860 and 1870 U.S. census this family moved across the state line into Henry Co., Alabama as that is where the family is found in 1870. Jackson Co., Florida is located in the Florida panhandle and is bordered on the north by what is now Houston Co., Alabama, but was at that time Henry Co. Solomon was a farmer and he continued to farm most, if not all of his life as far as I know. Once again the family was found in the 1880 U.S. census in Henry Co., Alabama. Solomon died on 02/16/1892. I don't know if they were living in Henry Co., Alabama or Jackson Co., Florida at the time of his death. Almira can be found in the J 900 U. S. census living with her oldest living son at that time in Robertson Co., Texas. She did return to Florida and died in Jackson Co., Florida on 12/06/1906 at the age of 82. She and Solomon were buried in Collins Chapel Cemetery just west of Malone, Jackson Co., Florida. Almira and Solomon had ten children.

b. UKNOWN DAUGHTER YARBOROUGH - It can be determined through the 1830 and 1840 U. S. census records of Chester Co., South Carolina that Green Berry and "Polly" had five daughters, however when the 1850 census of Jackson Co., Florida was taken, which was the first census that listed the names of the children only three daughters were listed. A fourth was later discovered but I have never been able to determine who their fifth daughter was. This daughter was born ca. 1820's in Chester Co., South Carolina, but I do not know if she married in Chester Co. before they moved to Jackson Co., Florida or married very soon after arriving there and I have been unable to find any records.

ELEANOR YARBOROUGH (HORNE) Born ca. 1828 in Chester Co., South Carolina, she grew up in Chester Co. and moved in her late teens with her parents and siblings to Jackson Co., Florida. There she married Elisha B. Home on 08/15/1859 in Jackson Co. Through many years of research I have been unable to find any other information on this family.

RHODA YARBOROUGH (LOCKHART). Born 04/17/1831 in Chester Co., South Carolina, she grew up in Chester Co., and moved in her mid-teens with her parents and Siblings to Jackson Co., Florida. There she met and married Perry Jackson Lockhart ca. 1848. Perry was born ca. 1825 in Alabama. This family can be found in the 1850 Jackson Co., Florida census living next to Green Berry Yarborough. According to census records Perry's occupation was that of a farmer and of a brick mason. When the civil war broke out Perry

enlisted in Co. B of the 15t1i Florida Cavalry, C.S.A. At least two of his Yarborough brother-in-laws served in the same unit. Shortly after the end of the civil war this family left Jackson Co., Florida and moved to Jefferson Co., Alabama. I do not know the reason for the move nor do I know if they aware of their Yarborough kin being in that area. The family stayed in Jefferson County approximately two or three years and moved again to neighboring Walker Co., Alabama just to the northwest of Jefferson Co. A little over thirty years later more Yarborough kin would move from neighboring Blount Co., Alabama into Walker Co., in the same vicinity that the Lockhart's lived. Whether or not they aware of their kinship at that time is unknown to me, but I can honestly say that when I attended a family reunion of the Yarborough's in Walker Co., Alabama in 2000 none were aware of the relationship. Rhoda and Perry remained in the Walker Co., Alabama area the rest of their lives near the Dora community. Perry died 10/21/1899 and Rhoda died on 05/04/1900 in Dora, Walker Co., Alabama. She is buried in the Davis Cemetery in Dora. Members of this family over the generations have used modified spellings and pronunciations of the name, primarily Lockart and Lockard, but rather than struggling with making sure I have used each modification of the original name correctly, which I probably wouldn't be able to do I will just stick with the original name LOCKHART throughout. Rhoda and Perry had eleven known children.

GREEN BERRY YARBOROUGH JR - Born 08/05/1832 in Chester Co., South Carolina, he was the first son born as a result of the union between Green Berry Sr. and Mary "Polly" McCalla after four daughters. He moved with his parents and siblings to Jackson Co., Florida as a teenager in the mid-to late l 840's. There he finished maturing into a young man and farmed on the family farm in Jackson Co. Green Berry Jr. is first found buying land in Jackson Co., Florida on 06/16/1856 when he purchases 159 acres. This land was public land for sale by the federal government. It does not disclose the purchase price but did state that payment was made in full. Green Berry is next found in Jackson Co., Florida records when he marries Nancy Oswald on 12/09/1860 in Jackson Co., Florida, Nancy was born O1/01/1841 in Florida, Green Berry again purchases land in Jackson Co., Florida on 12/05/1861 when he purchases 40 and six one hundreths of an acre. What was strange about this is that this was also public land for sale by the Federal (U.S.) government, but Florida had already succeeded from the Union. The document was signed Abraham Lincoln by W. O. Stoddard. Green Berry did not enter the fray between the Union and Confederacy at the outbreak of war but enlisted in Co. B. of the 15th Florida Cavalry C.S.A. on 08/10/1862, along with at least one of his younger brothers and a brother-in-law.

Green Berry Jr. was captured at Claiborne, Ala. on 04/12/1865 and discharged at Mobile on 04/20/1865. At that time he returned home to begin farming again.

Green Berry Jr. remained in Jackson Co., Florida for the remainder of his life and as far as I know was a life long farmer. He died on 09/01/1900 in Jackson Co., Florida. In 1903 his widow Nancy applied for a Confederate Widow's Pension. The pension was approved on 08/12/1903. Nancy died 01/25/1912 in Jackson Co., Florida. Green

Berry Jr. and Nancy are buried in Collins Chapel Cemetery in Malone, Jackson Co., Florida. Green Berry Jr. & Nancy had ten children.

- 1.) MARY AGNES YARBOROUGH (HOLLOWAY) Born 04/28/1862 in Jackson Co., Florida, Mary grew up in Jackson Co. and married Robert L Holloway on 12/20/1883 in Jackson Co., Florida.
- 2.) WILLIAM GREEN YARBOROUGH- Born 03/22/1866 in Jackson Co., Florida, he grew up in Jackson Co. and worked on the family farm. He married Ida M. Oswald on 02/11/1891 in Jackson Co., Florida. Ida was born 09/01/1867 in Florida.
- 3.) ALMA AUDREY YARBOROUGH (HOLLOWAY)- Born 03/22/1869 in Jackson Co., Florida, she grew up in Jackson Co., and married Z. I. Holloway on 03/21/1886 in Jackson Co., Florida. This was also a short union like her sister Mary's. Alma died on 10/12/1891 in Jackson Co. She is buried in Collins Chapel Cemetery, Malone, Jackson Co., Florida. As far as I know she and Z. I. had no children.
- 4.) JEFFERSON B. YARBOROUGH Born ca. 1870 in Jackson Co., Florida, he grew up in Jackson Co. on the family farm. He can be found living at home with his parents and siblings in the 1880 U. S. census for Jackson Co., Florida, and the special state census of 1885.
- 5.) MAUD ELIZABETH YARBOROUGH (OSWALD) Born 04/06/1872 in Jackson Co., Florida, she grew up in Jackson Co. and married Samuel Haywood Oswald on 02/22/1891 in Jackson Co., Florida. Samuel was born 11/27/1868 in Jackson Co., Florida, the son of Hiram and Penelope Blackwell Oswald.
- 6.) MINNIE IDELL YARBOROUGH (SIMMONS)- Born 11/27/1873 in Jackson Co., Florida, she grew up in Jackson Co., and married Carl Edward Simmons on 07/27/1890 in Jackson Co., Florida. This family can be found in the 1900 and 1910 Jackson Co., Florida U.S. census. Minnie died 12/28/1919. Carl passed away 11/18/1925. They are buried in Hickory Grove Cemetery, Jackson Co., Florida. Minnie and Carl had four children.
- 7.) MAY INEZ YARBOROUGH (STEPHENS)Born in 04/03/1876 in Jackson Co., Florida, she is listed in both the 1880 and 1900 U.S. census for Jackson Co., Florida living at home with her parents and siblings, as well as the special state census of 1885. May married Jefferson Davis Stephens on 01/13/1901 in Jackson Co., Florida

- 8.) TOYLIA YARBOROUGH- Born 05/26/1878 in Jackson Co., Florida, she can be found in the 1880 and 1900 U. S. census for Jackson Co., Florida living at home with her parents and siblings.
- 9.) SAMUEL MARION YARBOROUGH- Born 05/01/1880 in Jackson Co., Florida, he grew up in Jackson Co. He can be found on the U. S. census of Jackson Co., Florida in 1880 and 1900 living at home with his parents and siblings as well as the 1885 special state census.
- 10.) CORA H. YARBOROUGH-Born in May of 1882 according to the U.S. census for Jackson Co., Florida in 1900, she is at home with her parents and siblings at that time. She is also listed in the special state census of 1885.
- c. MARY ADELINE YARBOROUGH (MARTIN). Born in February of 1834 according to the 1900 U. S. census, in Chester Co., South Carolina, she moved to Jackson Co., Florida as an adolescent with her parents and siblings. She finished growing up in Jackson Co., and married Aaron D. Martin on 02/17/1853 in Jackson Co. Aaron was born in February of 1834 in Alabama, according to 1900 census records. This family remained in Jackson Co., Florida for most of their married lives. They can be found in the 1860 and 1880 U.S. census for Jackson Co., Florida. Aaron was somewhat of a rare commodity for anyone in the Yarborough family or associated with the Yarborough's. He was a slave owner. According to the 1860 census he owned one slave. Sometime in the 1880's or 1890's the family moved to Texas. Mary Adeline and Aaron can be found in the 1900 U. S. census for Hill Co., Texas. It appears that all the children of Mary Adeline and Aaron also made the trip to Texas. I do not know when or where Mary Adeline or Aaron died or where they are buried. Mary Adeline and Aaron had ten children.
 - 1.) LAURA A. MARTIN Born ca. 1854 in Jackson Co., Florida, she was shown living at home with her parents and siblings in the 1860 Jackson Co., Florida census.
 - 2.) JEWELL B. MARTIN Born ca. 1857 in Jackson Co., Florida. This person appeared To be a female named Jewell in the 1860 census.
 - 3.) JOHNLEWIS MARTIN Born 11/12/1860 in Jackson Co., Florida, he grew up in the area and married Mary Elizabeth Kincaid. Mary was born 08/24/1870 in Kentucky. This family apparently made the move out to Texas sometime in the I880's. They can be found in Fannin Co., Texas in the 1900 U. S. census.
 - 4.) VIRGINIA MARTIN Born ca. 1862 in Jackson Co., Florida, she grew up in the area And can be found in the 1880 U. S. census for Jackson Co., Florida living at home with her parents and siblings. There is a marriage listed in Jackson Co., Florida dated 10/15/1882 for a Jennie Martin and William J. Oliver.
 - 5.) THOMAS A. MARTIN Born in January of 1864 in Jackson Co., Florida, he grew up In Jackson Co. but apparently moved west to Texas with

the rest of his family in the 1880's. He married Elma F. (Unknown). Elma was born in September of 1877 in Mississippi. Thomas and Elma can be found in the 1900 U. S. census for Grayson Co., Texas. In 1910 they can be found in the U.S. census for Cameron Co., Texas. I do not know when Thomas or Elma passed away. They had five children as of the 1910 census. I could not find them in any census after 1910.

- 6.) MARTHA MARTIN (HENDERSON) Born in May of 1868 in Jackson Co., Florida. She grew up in Jackson Co. and moved to Texas with her parents and siblings as a teenager or young woman. She married (Unknown) Henderson. She can be found in the 1900 U. S. census in Hill Co., Texas very near her parents and living with a single brother. I do not know if she was a widow or her husband left her. She can also be found in the 1910 and 1920 U. S. census for Hill Co., Texas. I do not when or where Martha died. She had three children.
- 7.) MARY MARTIN (BELL) Born ca. 1869 in Jackson Co., Florida, she grew up in Jackson Co. and moved with her family to Texas as a teenager or young woman. I have a wedding date for her of 10/24/1894 marrying George Bell.
- 8.) EMERY L. MARTIN Born in February of 1874 in Jackson Co., Florida, he moved to Texas with his family as an adolescent or teenager. He can be found in the 1900 U.S. census for Hill Co., Texas living in the household with his sister Mm1ha Henderson and her children. Nothing else is known of him.
- 9.) WALTER MARTIN Born ca. 1875 in Jackson Co., Florida, he can be found in the 1880 U.S. census of Jackson Co., Florida with his parents and siblings. He moved to Texas with his family as a boy or adolescent. Nothing else is known of him.



Pendy Sr. Professor of Social Sciences, has been awarded the Claremont Institute's Henry Salvatori Prize, presented each year to an individual "who has distinguished himself or herself by an understanding of, and actions taken to, preserve and foster the principles upon which the United States was built."



Yarbrough, whose teaching areas include political philosophy and American political thought, has twice received fellowships from the National Endowment for the Humanities (1983-1984 and 2005-2006).


proved prophetic, as he and Ruth Evelyn Shipp were married and celebrated seventy-five years together.


Singlaub, Maj. Gen. John. Retired Major General John Singlaub, a decorated and well-known military, has passed away at 100. He died peacefully, survived by his children and loving wife, Joan. The Special Operations legend fought and survived in World War II. the Korean War, and the Vietnam War. John Singlaub first entered the US Army as 2nd Lieutenant for the US Army Infantry during World War II, January 14, 1943. He was immediately deployed to France, where he was part of Operation Jedburgh. Singlaub was assigned to Jedburgh team "JAMES" and worked with French Maquis to pave the way for the invasion of Normandy on June 6, 1944.



After Germany surrendered, Singlaub was sent to the Pacific, parachuting onto Hainan Island, in Nationalist China, leading an 8-man team to rescue American, Australian, and Dutch prisoners of war (POWs) from the Japanese. He was recruited in the CIA after the OSS had disbanded. He stayed in Manchuria to monitor the political situation of the Chinese Communists and the Nationalist Chinese in their Civil War. He led an infantry battalion in the Korean War. Because of his accomplishments, he was awarded the Silver Star.

Singlaub led the Military Assistance Command Vietnam Studies and Observation Group (MACV-SOG) during the Vietnam War, where he led a mission to interdict the Ho Chi Minh trail, a vital supply line for communists. Singlaub returned to the States to attend the Army Command and General Staff College and the Air War College. He also completed flight school at Fort Rucker

Active for over 40 years with the military, Singlaub was awarded the Distinguished Service Medal with the oak leaf cluster, the Silver Star, the Legion of Merit with not one but two oak leaf clusters, the Purple Heart, the Bronze Star, the French Croix de Guerre with Palm and Bronze Star, the Order of the Cloud and Banner, the United Nations Korea Medal, and the Air Medal with lead, cluster to name a few.



Yarbrough, Msgr. Michael. Msgr. Michael Yarbrough, 74, was born on Sept. 12, 1946 in St. Louis to Hilton and Dorothy Yarbrough. He was the first of five children, with siblings Patricia, Robert, Alan, and Debra

Yarbrough received his bachelor's degree in American History from the University of Missouri at St. Louis in 1969, his master's degree in Social Studies from Webster University in St. Louis in 1973, and his Master of Divinity Degree in Theology



from Sacred Heart School of Theology in Hales Corner, Wisc., in 1979. He also completed studies for a Doctorate in Ministry and Preaching from Aquinas Institute in St. Louis. He served an internship year at St. Matthew Church in San Antonio in 1979-1980. He was ordained in Milwaukee on April 19, 1980. Msgr. Yarbrough celebrated his 40th anniversary of priesthood this past April 19.

Upon ordination, Msgr. Yarbrough initially served brief parish assignments as a parochial vicar of St. Patrick Church in San Antonio and Our Lady of Good Counsel Church in Brownsville in 1984 before being assigned as parochial vicar at St. James the Apostle Church in San Antonio from 1984 to 1987, and again briefly as parochial vicar at St. Gregory the Great Church in San Antonio in 1987 before assuming the pastorate of St. Matthew Church in Jourdanton from 1987 to 1998.

Msgr. Yarbrough returned to San Antonio in 1998 to become the pastor of St. Matthew Church. During his tenure land was purchased for the Sports and Devotional Park there on May 22, 2000, and the park was dedicated February 8, 2003, by then-Archbishop Patrick Flores. The park includes baseball, softball, football/soccer fields, and outdoor Stations of the Cross and Our Lady of Guadalupe Shrine. Smoke filled the air on April 19, 2003, Holy Saturday, as part of the McDonald Family Center at the


parish caught on fire. The fire left the McDonald Family Center only partially usable. The reconstructed McDonald Family Center was dedicated on Feb. 8, 2005, by Archbishop Flores.



Visitation was held January 24at Angelus Funeral Home. On January 25, at Holy Trinity Church, visitation and rosary were held, followed by Mass with Archbishop Gustavo García-Siller, MSpS, presiding. A reception followed in the parish hall. Committal was held later at St. Matthew Church in Jourdanton.







